## SANBORNS OF REDLANDS, CALIFORNIA, PART 2

*Author's note: this article follows Part 1 in the Spring 2010 issue of Sanborn Signatures. That article dealt with the most prominent Sanborn family of Redlands, the Dr Christopher Allen Sanborn family [V C Sanborn # 1752 iv]. The lead author would like to thank Ardith & Jim James for their continuing research in Redlands records.*

### Edward Francis Sanborn Family

We first found Edward F Sanborn [V C Sanborn # 676 v] in Redland's records in the 1910 census. By that time he was over 60 years old and had had a business career in Massachusetts. He was born in Boston July 8, 1846, the oldest child of Christopher Page Sanborn, a carpenter, and his second wife, Margaret Ann Houston. He attended Boston schools as a child but his family had moved to the suburb town of Winchester by 1860.

In Winchester, Sanborn became involved in the shoe business. There apparently were shoe factories either in Winchester or nearby towns. Two other families on the same page of the census as the Sanborns in Winchester in 1860 were shoe makers. By 1870, living in Winchester, Edward's occupation was "Boot & Shoe Dealer", in 1880 a "shoe merchant". He was listed in the Boston city directory of 1872 as working for Sanford Gilmore & Co (shoes & leather), 33 Pearl St, boarding in Winchester.

About that time he became a shoe manufacturer. A book, "History of Stoneham, Massachusetts" (by William B Stevens & F L Whittier, 1891, page 227), gives a brief biography of Sanborn:

"Edward Francis Sanborn, although not a resident of Stoneham, is closely identified with the leading industry of the town, being the senior partner of the firm of Sanborn & Mann, one of the two largest shoe manufacturing firms in Stoneham. ... in 1881 [he] began the manufacture of shoes in this town in co-partnership with Arthur E Mann, and they have continued up to the present time, manufacturing a medium grade of men's and women's shoes, mostly for the southern and western trade. They occupy the John Hill & Co. factory on Main Street, where they have been ever since they started, and their office in Boston is at 51 Lincoln Street. The firm began moderately, but now employ about 400 hands, the building having been twice added to during the ten years they have been in business. Mr. Sanborn lives in a handsome residence in Winchester, Mass. See page 52 for view of their factory."

This partnership was about to dissolve when the book was published. There was a small item in "Public Documents of Massachusetts, 1891", Issue # 36, 'Industrial Chronology', page 319. Under Stoneham for November 1891 was the comment: "Sanborn & Mann, shoes, dissolved; business continued by A. E. Mann under the style of A. E. Mann & Co. — E. F. Sanborn & Co organized for manufacture of women's shoes." The Sanborn & Mann building survived until at least 1981 when the 1981 "MHC Reconnaissance Survey Town Report: Stoneham" (page 7) refers to "the Sanborn & Mann factory on Main Street, a five story structure with a High Victorian Gothic stair tower."

It's not clear if the E F Sanborn & Co enterprise lasted very long as he and his family were living in Nashua NH in 1900. There he seems to be the Superintendent of a shoe manufactory, "Supt Shoe Mfr", rather than an owner.

Sanborn married Louisa O Eddy 23 August 1893 in West Newton MA and they had a single child, Frederick William Sanborn, born 14 August 1894 in Winchester MA.

As so many Easterners did, the Sanborns decided to try their luck in California and by 1910 the three of them were living in Redlands, San Bernardino County, where they owned a farm: Edward, a farmer at age 64, wife Louise, and Fred W in school. The 1915 Redlands city directory had them listed as orange growers, living at E Crescent Ave, east of Morrison, with Frederick graduated from Redlands High School in 1913. They didn't stay in Redlands very long. By 1920 they were in Long Beach CA where he was a clerk in a ship yard. Their son, Fred, 25, had no occupation listed in that census.

We don't know what happened to him after 1920 except that he died 23 May 1925 in San Bernardino County. His death certificate would tell whether he had moved back to Redlands or not. His wife, Louise E, seems to have

died (it's hard to read the index) on September 6?, 1921, in Alameda County - the Oakland area.

Their son, Frederick W Sanborn, served in the military in World War One. He married Elizabeth Lowery about 1922, probably in CA. She may be the Elizabeth Lowry in Redlands in 1920, a librarian at the Public Library. She was born in Illinois, 14 September 1884, probably the daughter of Edward & Catherine Lowry. According to the CA Voter Registration lists, they lived in the San Francisco Bay area from at least 1926 through 1944, moving every couple of years within Oakland, then to San Francisco, back to Oakland, then to Berkeley. Frederick is listed as an accountant most years and Elizabeth as housewife. According to his WWII draft registration in 1942 (at age 48!) he worked for Burdens Dairy Delivery Co in Oakland and was 6 feet tall with blue eyes and black hair. Elizabeth, 10 years older than her husband, died 11 April 1964 in Alameda County; Frederick on 11 May 1977 in Santa Cruz County – his last residence, according to the Social Security Death Index, was in Scotts Valley CA. They were buried in Mountain View Cemetery, Oakland CA. There was no indication in the records of any children.

These Sanborns probably had little impact on Redlands. Edward F Sanborn seemed to have been moving down the economic ladder by the time they reached CA: from mill owner in MA to mill superintendent in NH to farmer in Redlands to clerk in a ship yard in Long Beach in 1920.

### Edwin Newell Sanborn Family

In contrast to Edward F Sanborn, above, Edwin N Sanborn had three wives, at least six children, and at least 5 step children. Like Edward F Sanborn, however, Edwin was born in New England, lived and married there and then moved to California & Redlands by 1915, when he was listed in the Redlands city directory as a carpenter. I didn't find any evidence that any of his 5 children moved to California with him.

Edwin was V C Sanborn # 648 ii where VCS briefly detailed the vital events of his family up to 1897: born 24 July 1847; married Etta J Plumer of Gilmanton NH; carpenter in Laconia NH in 1897; named their 4 daughters, S Jennie (1874-94), Myrtie B (1876 - ), Nettie M (1883 - ), & Carrie L (1885 - ). Although Edwin is a 'farmer' in the 1880 & 1870 censuses of Gilmanton, his father & an older brother were 'house carpenters' in the 1860 census. His wife, Etta, died in the late 1890s & he was listed as a widower in the 1900 census of Laconia, a carpenter, living with his three remaining daughters.

He married for the second time to Elvira (Price) Prescott about 1904 and they had two children by the 1910 census: Eva M, born about 1905, and Edwin N, born about 1908. She brought with her two children from her first marriage to John W Prescott (born 1825; married her about 1891, died 1900-04). Prescott was about 45 years older than Elvira. Their two daughters were Eliza A Prescott (born Oct 1894) & Alice W (born June 1897) who are with Edwin & Elvira in Concord NH in 1910. Edwin, in 1910, was a carpenter with his own shop in Concord. Presumably they divorced shortly after that because Edwin was in the 1915 Redlands city directory as a carpenter, with no wife, and Elvira was with a new husband (her third), Willard W Colby, a lodging house keeper, in Concord NH in the 1920 census with three of her children, Eva & Edwin Sanborn Jr, and Eliza Prescott. I haven't found further information on Eva & Edwin Jr.

Edwin's third marriage was to Leona, probably in the early 1920's. She had arrived at Ellis Island on 15 February 1892 as Leona Schupbach, age 16. She was one of the first emigrants to arrive at the new Ellis Island immigration station, opened only on January 1, 1892. She arrived with family members, probably her brother, Armond's, family: Armond (25, farmer), Lina (23), and a boy (2), all from Switzerland.

She married her first husband, August Justin Boyle/Boel, also born in Switzerland, in the late 1890s, probably in CT. August & Leona had four children: Leo A (born 1898, died young), William L (1899 - July 1973), Theodore C ( 24 August 1904 - 22 March 1976), Laurence Paul (1 November 1906 - 23 January 1990). They lived in Torrington CT from 1900-20. The 1921 Torrington CT city directory listed Leona as a widow, so August died soon after the 1920 census and Leona shortly after that decided to head west to California with her two youngest children. Theodore & Laurence Boyle lived in the Redlands area with their mother & their step-father, Edwin N Sanborn, in the 1920s & 30s; William Boyle remained in Torrington CT. Leona's death notice suggested she arrived about 1921 in Redlands. There was a Mrs. Leona Sanborn in the Redlands voter registration for 1922 as housewife, living at 527 East State St. In this voter registration list, however, Edwin N Sanborn was living at 120 7<sup>th</sup> St, so this

doesn't confirm that this Leona was Edwin's wife; only that she may be. In the Redlands voter registrations online, the entries for 1928 have Leona's son, Laurence P Boyle, living with Edwin N Sanborn at 1008 E Central Ave. It's safe to presume here that Laurence's mother, Leona, was there too, even if she didn't register to vote that year. Edwin & Leona Sanborn, & two of her sons, Theodore & Laurence Boyle, were living together at 1008 E Central Ave in the 1930 census of Redlands.

Edwin's occupation was pretty consistent in Redlands, a carpenter, cabinet maker, or "planing mill", in the 1915, 1927, 1931, 1936, 1939, & 1941 city directories, the 1930 census, & the voter registrations from 1917/18 to 1940. Given that he was about 30 years older than Leona, it was natural that he would be the first to die, as he did on 16 November 1941 in San Bernardino County. His obituary in the local paper noted that he had lived in Redlands for 30 years; i.e. since 1911. "Until his last illness which has confined him to his bed for several weeks, he continued to carry on his work as a cabinet maker and planing mill owner. ... When a youngster [he] learned the trade which he followed and loved all his life." He left his wife, Leona, and "two daughters, Mrs. Mertie Hoxby and Mrs. Nettie Hoyt, Laconia, New Hampshire." He was buried in Hillside Cemetery. Who were not mentioned in the obituary were his two children from his second marriage, Eva M & Edwin N - perhaps he had not kept in contact with them or they were deceased.

After his death, Leona Sanborn continued to live in Redlands with her son, Theodore Boyle. One can follow their changes of address through the Redlands voter registrations, 1942 to 1956. Then, somewhat oddly, in the 1958 voter registration she was listed as Mrs. Leona Boyle living with Theodore C Boyle at 1370 E Colton Ave, Redlands. The California Death Index also listed her as Leona J Boyle, born 3 September 1878, died 7 June 1964 in San Bernardino County; her mother's maiden name was Geanmara. The death notice in the Redlands "Daily Facts" noted that Mrs. Leona Pauline Boyle, age 87, resident of Redlands for 43 years, died in San Bernardino on 7 June 1964. Sometime in the mid-1950s, then, she stopped using 'Sanborn' as her surname and reverted back to Boyle, her sons' surname. We have to speculate on the reason why she did that. It could be that her son, Theodore, with whom she lived during her widowhood, conducted her official contacts with authorities and decided to register his mother as 'Boyle'. There is also the possibility that Leona & Edwin were never officially married. Contact with descendants might be able to explain the name switch. The records of Hillside Memorial Park, Redlands, where she was buried indicate that she was survived by sons, Laurence P Boyle of Big Bear CA, William Louis Boyle of Torrington CT, & Theodore C Boyle of Redlands; and 6 grandchildren.

To summarize: Edwin, a carpenter, raised four children with his first wife in Gilmanton & Laconia NH; she died in the late 1890s. He married a younger (by 20+ years) widow with two children in 1904 with whom he had two more children. They apparently divorced shortly after the 1910 census and, according to his obituary, he moved to Redlands CA. He was listed there in the 1915 city directory as a carpenter. By the 1920 census his mother was living with him in Redlands. In the early 1920s, when he was about 70, he married a younger (by about 30 years) widow with 2 teenage sons living with her. During this time in Redlands he seemed to ply his carpentry trade on a steady basis up to shortly before his death at age 94 - although his obituary stated him as being 97, the various sources on his age suggest July 1847 was most likely his birth date.

[Footnote about his middle name: the California death index gave his middle name as "Noel". The local obituary noted it as "Newell". According to the V C Sanborn book, Edwin had a first cousin, "Newell Sanborn", and an uncle "Newell Sanborn" so it probably was "Newell".]

#### Clifton Eliot Sanborn Family

The fourth New England Sanborn family to live in Redlands was the Clifton E Sanborn family. He was V C Sanborn # 962 iii. Clifton was born in Boston MA 4 September 1878, son of John Franklin & Caroline A (Bullard) Sanborn, a "marketman" according to V C Sanborn. He grew up in the Allston section of Boston and the nearby city of Somerville MA. In the 1900 census, Clifton was living with his widowed mother, Carrie A, and two siblings on Greenville St in Somerville. His occupation was 'clerk in Boston Packing Co'.

By 1906 he was living in Redlands - he was in the voter registration for that year, age 27, a solicitor, living at the corner of Colton Ave & Orange St. From then through the mid-1940s his occupation regularly appeared in the voter registrations as 'real estate' and 'insurance' with occasional other listings: 'broker' (1918), 'realtor' (1926), 'rancher' (1928). From 1912 to the mid-1940s he lived at 114 Angelica St (1912-22), 1114 E Lugonia Ave (1926-30), & 809 E Colton Ave (1932-46) and had an office in town.

Clifton married Alma Leona Phelps on 15 September 1910, according to one source (Cuyler Reynolds, "Hudson-Mohawk Genealogical & Family Memoirs", online at [www.ebooksread.com](http://www.ebooksread.com)): she was a member of the Phelps family of Gloversville in upstate NY, "Alma Leona, born October 26, 1877; married, September 15, 1910, Clifton Elliot [sic] Sanborn, born September 4, 1877." She was the daughter of George Roswell & Josephine M (Whitney) Phelps. Because Alma was in Gloversville NY in the 1910 census (taken in April) and Clifton was in Redlands with his mother, one wonders how they met. The 1930 census also suggested that they married in 1910/11.

By 1920 the Clifton & Alma Sanborn family had two sons: Clifton Eliot Sanborn Jr (born 15 November 1913) & Donald Phelps Sanborn (born 23 December 1917). Clifton Sr's occupation was real estate agent. In 1930 his occupation was a fruit farmer, which may reflect the 'rancher' occupation in his 1928 voter registration. When he registered for the draft in 1918 he listed as his occupation: notary public, insurance agent, & farmer. His obituary ("Redlands Daily Facts", 19 August 1952) noted that he died in Ontario CA on 18 August 1952. He was survived by his wife, Alma, sons Dr Clifton E Jr of Ontario CA & Donald P of North Hollywood CA; sister Mrs. Leslie Turcott of Boston MA; grandchildren Clinton & Susan Sanborn of North Hollywood. His wife, Alma, died in San Bernardino County on 21 December 1974.

Clifton E Sanborn Jr married Edith J Miller in the mid to late 1940s: they first appear together in the voter registrations for Ontario, San Bernardino County, in 1948, then in 1950 & 1954. The California birth indexes show they had at least three children, all born in San Bernardino County: Carolyn Sue, 1 May 1953, Elizabeth Ann, 23 June 1955, & Clifton E, 29 Sep 1958. An undocumented online source reported that he graduated from the University of Redlands & Baylor College of Medicine (Houston TX) and worked 40 years as a medical doctor in the Upland area of San Bernardino County. He died 26 May 1994.

Donald Phelps Sanborn enlisted in the military in Los Angeles in July 1942. By that time he had completed 2 years of college and was single. He married Dorothy M Wolf about 1943 or 1944. She was registered to vote at his parents' home address in 1944 & 1946. They had three children: Clinton L (born in 1946) and Susan (born 1949) mentioned in his father's obituary above, plus Kathy J, born in 1956. The online Public Records & Phone Directories indicate he lived in Sun Valley CA [north of Los Angeles] in 1970 & the 1990s. He died 7 April 2009 and, according to the SSDI, his last residence was Glendale, Los Angeles County, CA. Dorothy Mae Sanborn had died 3 December 2008, also according to the SSDI. The CA marriage & birth indexes indicate that their three children married in the 1970s and had at least 4 children between them.

#### John Halvor Sanborn Family

This fifth 'Sanborn in Redlands' wasn't born in New England but does have strong NE roots. His grandfather, Isaac Newton Sanborn, was born in Sanbornton NH in 1831 and, according to V C Sanborn, moved to Minnesota where son Arthur Newton Sanborn was born (1859), then to Missouri (1870 census) where Arthur's son, John Halvor Sanborn was born (15 November 1885), and on to Pomona, Los Angeles County, CA, probably between 1885 (John H's birth in MO) & 1888 (when John H's brother, Carleton, was born in CA). John Halvor Sanborn was # 2080 i (i) in V C Sanborn. An online transcription of a 1920 book, "History of Pomona Valley", has a brief biography of Carleton H Sanborn which referred to the family's move to CA in 1886.

In fact the only Redlands connection for John H Sanborn seemed to be that he & his family lived in Redlands during the 1920 census; his occupation being forest ranger for the US Forest Service. Other records note he lived nearby: Pomona in 1910 as a brick layer (his father & grandfather constructed brick buildings in the area); Ontario in 1930 as a brick mason. The California voter registrations gave his residence & occupation as bricklayer living in Ontario in 1908; ranger living in Mentone 1920 & 1922; bricklayer living in San Bernardino in 1928 & in Ontario in 1930. His WWI draft registration had him a forest ranger, living in Camp Bonita, Azusa, Los Angeles County, with his wife living in Ontario CA.

John Halvor Sanborn married Nellie Ruth Kirkpatrick 18 February 1906. They had four children, Ronald V (12 January 1907 - 16 November 1908), Arthur Dean (17 August 1911 - 3 April 1931), Eleanor Bertha (15 October 1914 - 27 April 1975), & Leona Marie (21 April 1917 - 11 August 1980).

There is a well documented website for the Kirkpatrick family that includes transcriptions from newspapers. The Ontario CA "Daily Report" of 21 February 1956, page 3, reported on the 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary reception for John & Nellie. They were then living in Three Rivers CA. The reception was held at the home of their daughter,

Mrs. Eleanor St Clair of Ontario. The Sanborns had lived in Ontario for many years before they moved to Three Rivers. They had been married at the home of Nellie's late parents, Mr. & Mrs. J D Kirkpatrick, then of 302 East B St, Ontario. John H Sanborn had worked for the US Forest Service for 36 years in the San Bernardino forest area. Family members attending were their daughters, Mrs. St Clair and Mrs. Leona Bourdet of La Puente CA, and grandchildren, Richard St Clair, 15, Michael St Clair, 17, Timmy Bourdet, 6, & Larry Bourdet, 8.

John's obituary in the "Los Angeles Times" of 9 February 1964 named as survivors his wife, Mrs. Nellie R Sanborn of Los Osos CA, daughters Mrs. Eleanor St Clair of Ontario and Mrs. Louis C Bourdet of La Puente, sister Mrs. A C Lester of Yucaipa; 4 grandsons; 6 great grandchildren. He was buried in Pomona Cemetery. His widow, Nellie, died 18 August 1965 in Los Angeles County.
