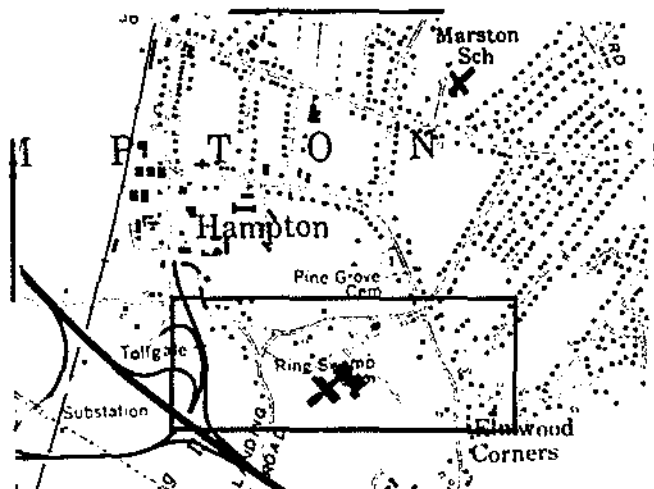

HAMPTON THEN...

The town of Hampton, NH is one of the most historic areas in New Hampshire. In 1638, John, William, and Stephen Sanborne settled this town, along with the other followers of Rev. Stephen Bachiler. Much has changed in the intervening 347 years!

The original Hampton centered around an area called "Meeting House Green," the site of the first church. This rectangular area was surrounded by the homes and farms of more than 50 of the early settlers.

Today, Meeting House Green is almost unrecognizable. A marker remains to memorialize the spot where the first church stood and a rectangular, grassy park surrounded by small stones with metal plaques honors the original settlers with names and dates.



AND NOW

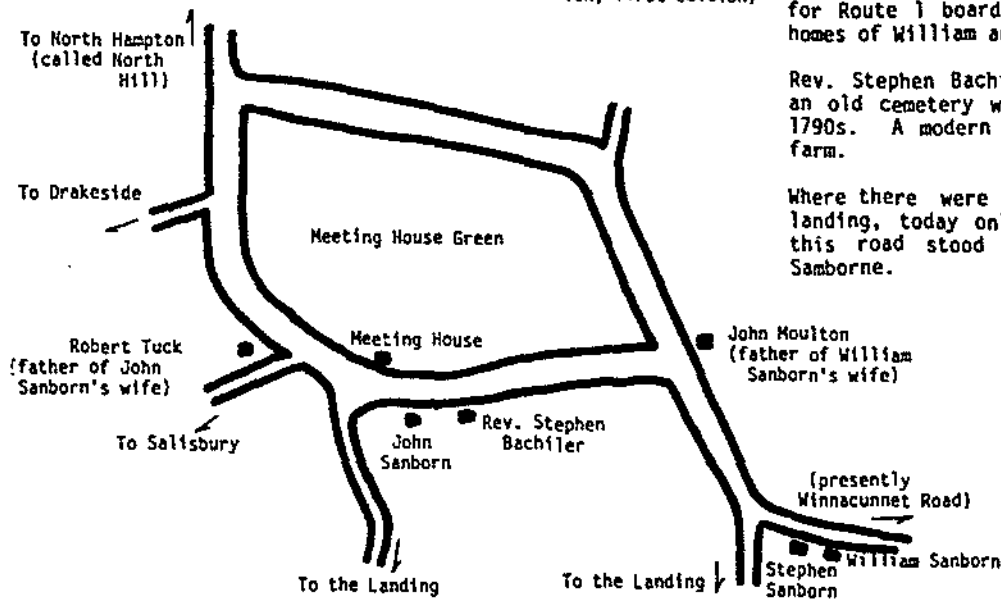
The downtown area of Hampton has moved to the north and east of the original green. A major interchange for Route 1 borders the western edge, near the old homes of William and Hezekiah Swaine.

Rev. Stephen Bachiler's old farm is now the site of an old cemetery which began to be used in the late 1790s. A modern business stands on John Sanborne's farm.

Where there were once two roads to the original landing, today only the eastern one survives. Near this road stood the homes of William and Stephen Sanborne.

SARAH KNIGHT

Ever since I learned of my first Sanborn line, I wondered about the tragic words in V.C. Sanborn's book which told the story of Zadok (3) Sanborn and his wife, Sarah _____. Nothing was known about Zadok, son of Stephen (2) and Hannah Philbrick Sanborn, born 1 June 1707 at Hampton, NH, except that he died before the birth of his only child. His wife's maiden name was unknown and her fate after the baptism of little Zadok (4) in 1736 was a mystery. After searching for years in every imaginable New Hampshire record, my husband (who descends from Zadok (3)'s sister) and I, stopped our active efforts to find anything new, but we kept our eyes open, just in case.

Several weeks ago, an amazing thing happened. While searching through unrelated, Massachusetts records, my husband, George, found the answer to the mystery at the New England Historic Genealogical Society. Within a few minutes, a puzzle which had persisted since the turn of the century, was solved.

Sarah, wife of Zadok (3) Sanborn, was born 6 June 1710 at Reading, MA, the first child of Amos (4) (Joseph [3,2], John [1]) and Sarah _____ Knight (THE KNIGHT FAMILY by Charles S. Tibbetts, unpublished manuscript dated 10 April 1941).

She married firstly Zadok (3) Sanborn (Stephen [2], William [1]) 22 February 1730/1 at Lancaster, MA (Lancaster Vital Records). How she met Zadok, whose family had always lived in the southeastern part of New Hampshire, must be an interesting story, but we can only speculate. After their marriage, they apparently traveled back and forth from Brentwood, NH, Zadok's home, to Lancaster, MA, Sarah's home, for the birth of young Zadok, 30 April 1733, appears in the Lancaster Vital Records. This conflicts by 11 days with V.C. Sanborn's report of his birthdate. There is no mention of the death of Zadok (3), though, and no probate records or land divisions in Brentwood. We have only V.C. Sanborn's unreferenced word that Zadok (3) died before his son's birth.

Between 1736 and 1740, Sarah Knight Sanborn married secondly John (3) Norris (Moses [2], Nicholas [1]) of West Epping, NH. In 1740 she had his son, Israel.

In her father's will, proved 17 August 1758 (Worcester Probate 35604), she is called Sarah, "my eldest daughter, the wife of John Norris at Ipen [Epping] in the province of Hampshire," and is given 5 shillings.

Many researchers who knew of Sarah, did not know of her as the wife of Zadok Sanborn, but as the wife of her second husband, John Norris, because of this will. At least one Knight genealogist (Tibbetts), knew that she was Zadok's wife, but no Sanborn researcher had made the connection.

Many of us descend from Zadok and Sarah Knight Sanborn because their only child, Zadok (4) had a large family.

Guy C. Arnold died 23 March 1985 in Burlington, MA after a short illness. He was 91. M. Mr. Arnold was an 80-year member of the Federated Church of Greenville, NH, in which he served as a deacon for more than 70 years. He was a corporator of the Village Savings Bank of Greenville for more than 40 years. Mr. Arnold leaves a son, Robert C., three grandchildren, two great-grandchildren and nieces and nephews.

Doris W. Sanborn

Doris W. Sanborn died 27 January 1985 at the Riverside Rest Home in Dover, NH. She was 81. Doris was born in Manchester, NH and was the widow of Edwin H. Sanborn who died in 1965. Mr. Aurel Stuart has agreed to be the photographer again this year; we know that many of you were very pleased with the job he did last year.

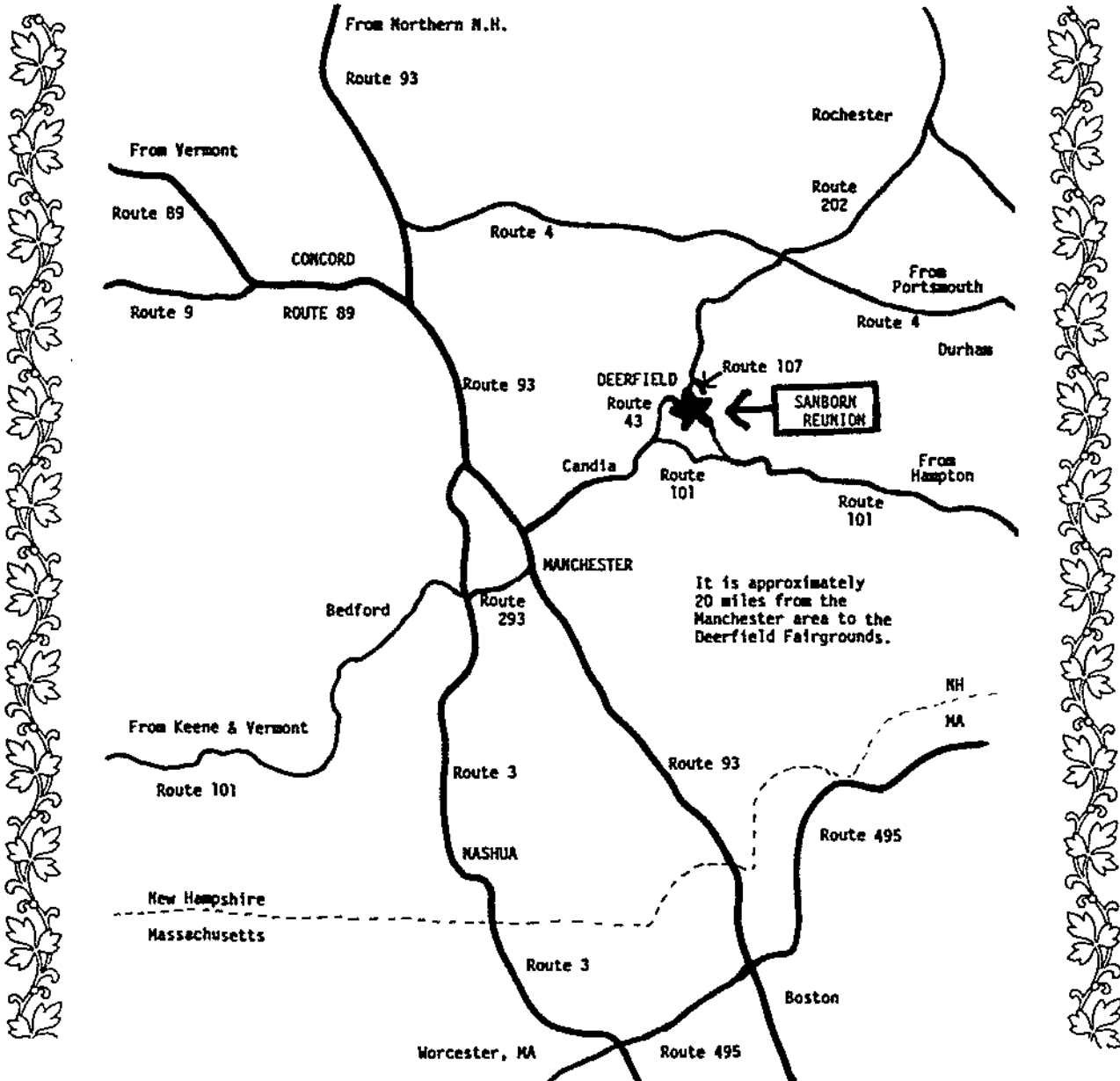

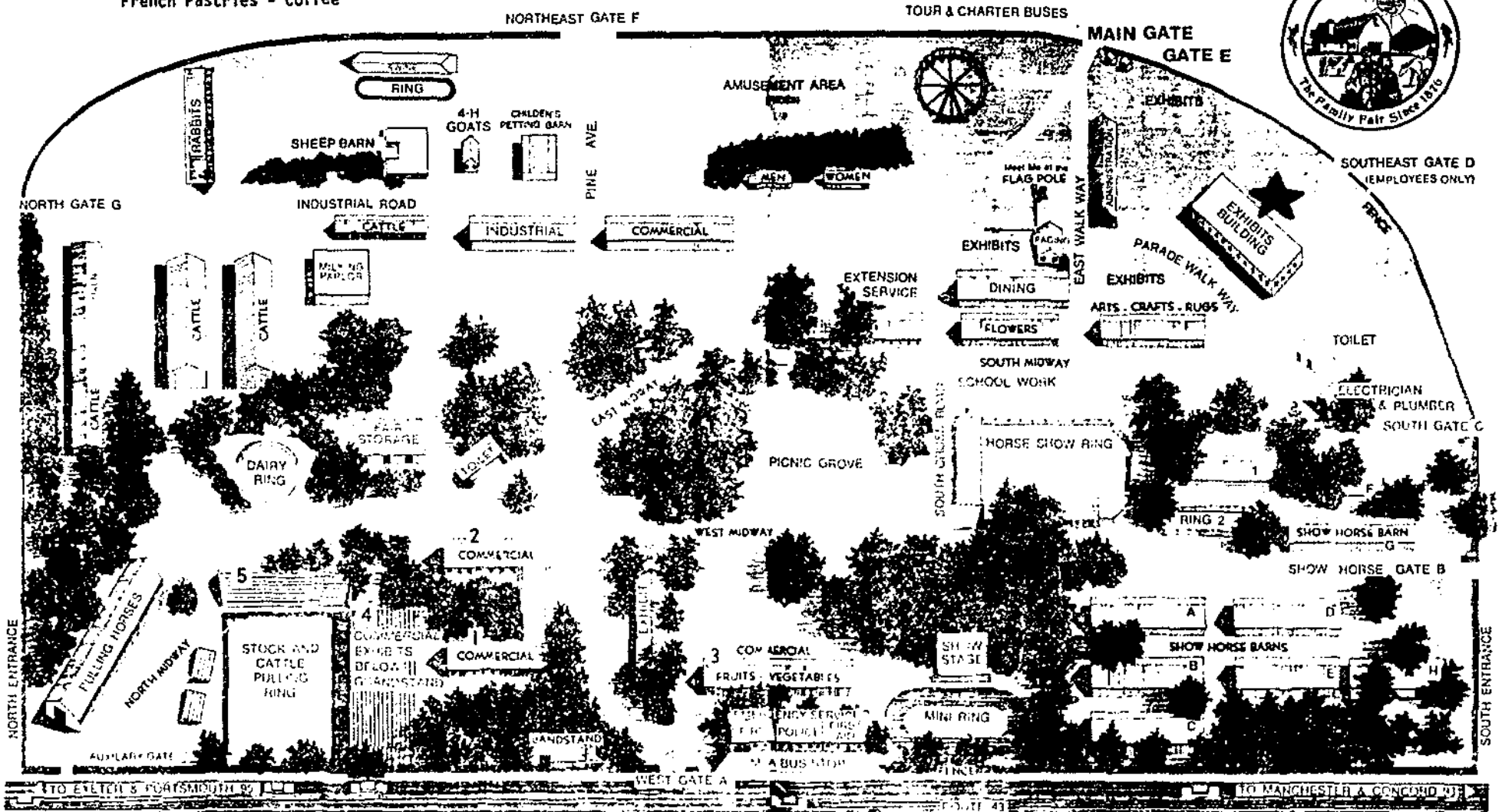

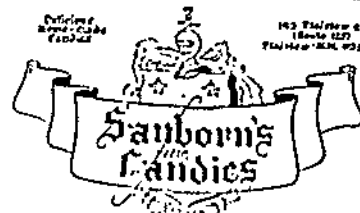
