THE TALE OF THE WANDERING ALBUM

Everyone loves a happy ending, and this true account of a photograph album in search of a home should make you smile. It is an old, leather-bound album containing many photos from the mid-1800's to about 1905. However, its owner no longer wanted it, and one day it ended up in De Witt's antique shop in Carlsbad, California. Bonnie Moore of nearby Oceanside spied the album in her daughter's antique shop and decided to rescue it. After taking a good look and realizing that at least eleven families were represented in those pages, she placed an ad in the "Genealogical Helper," offering to give the album to the first person who wrote and requested it.

That lucky first request came from Peggy Hartford Marsh of Bend, Oregon, who had connections to nine of the eleven surnames in the album. She was able to read the handwriting on the back of some of the pictures, but about half remained unidentified. Because many of the photos bore the name SANBORN, Peggy gleefully sent a set of photocopies from the album to Florida SFA member, Nick Sanborn, with whom she'd been corresponding about their mutual Marsh family interests.

Now here is where I became involved. Nick and I have swapped genealogical materials, theories, and discoveries for several years, and he knew I would be fascinated by the photos. I took one look at the two pictures on the first page, whooped with delight, and knew immediately which family I was holding in my hands! The subjects depicted were

brothers Leavitt Riley Sanborn and William Horace Sanborn of Lemoore, California. I had researched their family two and a half years ago while writing the story of Dr. Alvin L. Sanborn for the "Sanborn Signatures." The photos in Peggy Marsh's album spanned several generations of the Sanborn/Leavitt family who came from New Hampshire to Illinois in 1834 and to Wisconsin in 1848. Their offspring fanned out in several directions. Son John Leavitt Sanborn went on to California, married Sarah Adelia Dean and eventually settled in Lemoore, in the San Joaquin Valley. Their story appeared in the Fall 1994 issue of "Sanborn Signatures" in the article about Dr. Alvin L. Sanborn.

With the help of research notes, V.C. Sanborn's book, 1899, and Volume One of the *Leavitt* genealogy published by Emily L. Noyes, 1941, Nick and I were able to identify more of the photos. About a third of the 75 remain a mystery, however.

When the photocopies were sent to my address in southern California, the contents of the album had gone full circle--an amazing happenstance, for I live less than 100 miles from the album's starting point in Carlsbad! In July a set of photocopies was dispatched to a surprised Sally Stephenson in Arizona, daughter of Dr. Alvin L. Sanborn. Sally was very pleased to see the likeness of her grandfather, William Horace Sanborn, as well as photos of other relatives.

Peggy Marsh has kindly offered to make copies of any of the photos in the album for serious-minded researchers who have connections to the people listed below. She asks only for reimbursement of her costs of reproducing and mailing.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Near Ashland WI there is a Sanborn Methodist Church in a village of Sanborn, named after two brothers. Living nearby in 1996 were Mrs. Agnes and Gary Sanborn. Currently a new church is being built with most of the members doing the work to save on costs. - *Letter from Shirley Anderson.*

In Cedarburg WI there were two other SANBORNS, Gerald and Tylor, there in 1996, from the Ozaukee Phone Book. - *Letter from Jean Ponfils (a new SFA member who enrolled herself and two children - Scott Ponfils and Melissa Sheveland.*

SANBORN, Cynthia, 34, of West Bath ME, works as an apprentice ironworker helping to build the \$165 million Portland-South Portland Bridge which is taking her to new heights. She is the first woman in a four-year apprenticeship program run by the ironworker's union. She was accepted into the program after completing a 14-week course offered by Women Unlimited, an Augusta-based corporation that helps women find skilled trade work. The apprentices join 12 journeyman

ironworkers and one crane operator in building the support structure for the drawbridge over the Fore River, a replacement for the Million Dollar Bridge. In just two months, they've laid nearly 1,000 feet of red steel girders along concrete support piers built on the South Portland side. It is targeted for completion by the end of 1996. - *Bangor ME Daily News, Fall 1995.*

SANBORN, Boyce: "Oil tanker disables Portland drawbridge" - a spill follows collision; traffic snarled. A 560' oil tanker slammed into the drawbridge over the Fore River leaving a 1 1/2 mile long oil slick, shutting down the harbor and closing indefinitely the main transportation link between this city and neighboring South Portland. The Liberian-flagged *Julie N* lost an undetermined amount of its 210,000-barrel cargo of home heating oil in a collision with the quarter mile-long Million Dollar Bridge on its way to a dock a mile upstream at the Sprague Energy Terminal. The spill disrupted shipping traffic into Portland and forced the international ferry to relocate to Bar Harbor, and Boyce SANBORN, deputy police chief in South Portland, had the worst news of all - the Million Dollar Bridge "will be closed for an undetermined amount of time", he said. - *The Boston Globe, Saturday, Sep 28, 1996.*

SANBORN, Donna L. was among the students inducted in the Alpha Lambda Kappa Chapter of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society at North Shore Community College in Danvers MA. - *Danvers MA Herald, 2 Feb 1995.*

SANBORN, Lester B., (Class of 1951 UNH) is technology manager of Fabricated Products for Exxon Chemical Co., and is located at Florham Park NH. Since joining Exxon in 1951, he has held several engineering and supervisory positions in England, Germany, France, and the Netherlands, and lives in Mendham NJ. - *Alumnus, Sep 1975.*

SANBORN, Richard, 84, a long time resident of Rumney NH, was recently reported missing by relatives and later found after 14 hours 1/4 mile down the road from his home and 75' deep in the woods. NEW FINDINGS

In 1898 wrought iron gates were brought from Sienna, Italy, as a gift for the University of the South at Sewanee TN, from Dr. and Mrs. Andrew Moore, grandparents of Cynthia Sanborn Ware and Marymor (Boo) Sanborn Cravens who built Driftwood, where the Cravens now live. Over the years the gates fell into disrepair and the lack of funds and indifference from the staff kept anything from being done until a group of friends of Abbott Martin, who with student workers and German prisoners of war cleaned up the area with local donations and created a lovely wooden strip now called Abbo's Alley.

The University was established by the Episcopal Bishops of 12 southern states for a Divinity School as Alexandria VA was too far away (by train) and too expensive after the Civil War (1865). Recently, it was ranked 14 out of 14 as the best of the small universities.

Cynthia S. Ware, now of New Orleans gave the gates to these Friends of Abbo's Alley to adorn the entranceway on Texas Avenue to the Ravine Garden, provided they were insured and located across from Driftwood, where they now can be seen. The new plaque now reads - In proud memory of Dr. and Mrs. Andrew Moses Moore and their daughter Mary Moore Sanborn - 1996. - *The Sewanee Mountain Messenger*, 7 March 1996.

NOTE: When the playwright, Tennessee Williams, died in 1983 at 69, he left his fortune in trust for the care of his older sister, Rose, who had been institutionalized as schizophrenic and lobotomized in 1937. After Rose's death last September at 86, the remainder of Williams' \$7 million estate, as well as the rights to royalties from his plays, went to *The University of the South in Sewanee TN*. The Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright never visited the school, but he heard stories about it from his grandfather, the Rev. Walter E. Dakin, a colorful character who attended Sewanee in the 1890's. The funds will be used to build a performing-arts complex supported by a foundation named for Williams' grandfather and to support the creative-writing program. The school is home to *The*

Sewanee Review", America's oldest literary quarterly. - Ed.

Since the amount is not enough to build a new hospital, lawyers for Lahey Hitchcock Clinic and Advantage HEALTH Corporation have asked that the endowment be given to one of its satellite operations - the Medical Center at Symmes, in Arlington. But one of the lawyers representing Cambridge Trust Company said Sanborn would have indicated Symmes if he had wanted his money to go there. Symmes was in existence when he drew his will. As a matter of fact he was hospitalized there during his last illness. The Trust Company was seeking the money go to Mount

More on the 1995 version of "the *Scarlet Letter*", per the Orange County Register of 13 Feb 1995, an article called 'Some *Scarlet Letter* scenes are blue'. Director Roland Joffe made a rush round trip to Paris last week to receive the prestigious Officier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres Award and is now back editing his "very '90" version of Nathaniel Hawthorne's classic novel in which Demi Moore, Gary Oldman and Robert Duvall star. Although the film won't be the nudie romp outlined in early versions of the script, Joffe says it will contain "some very mature" love scenes. he also says Moore and Oldman prove to be "an explosive mixture" portraying the lovers in an adulterous affair. He notes: "Hawthorne was forced to write the story in code because of the very puritanical times (the 19th century) - still it was criticized as too sexual, and some said it should be banned because it encouraged girls to be bad. We've broken parts of that code, while still being very honest to the book. This is a tale of romance and the consequences of that romance - a hymn to disobedience." "The *Scarlet Letter*" previously was translated to the screen in 1926, 1934 and 1973.

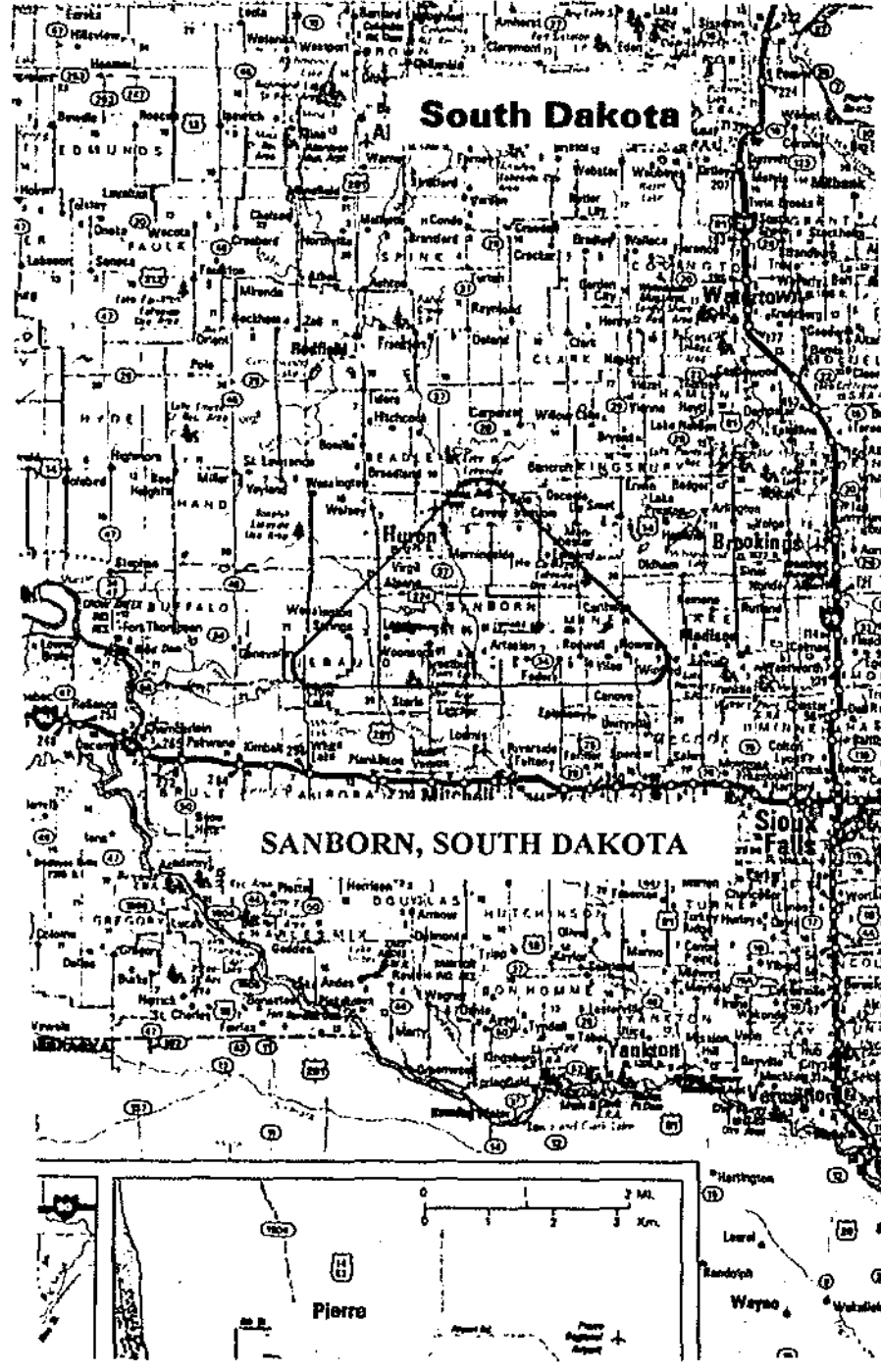
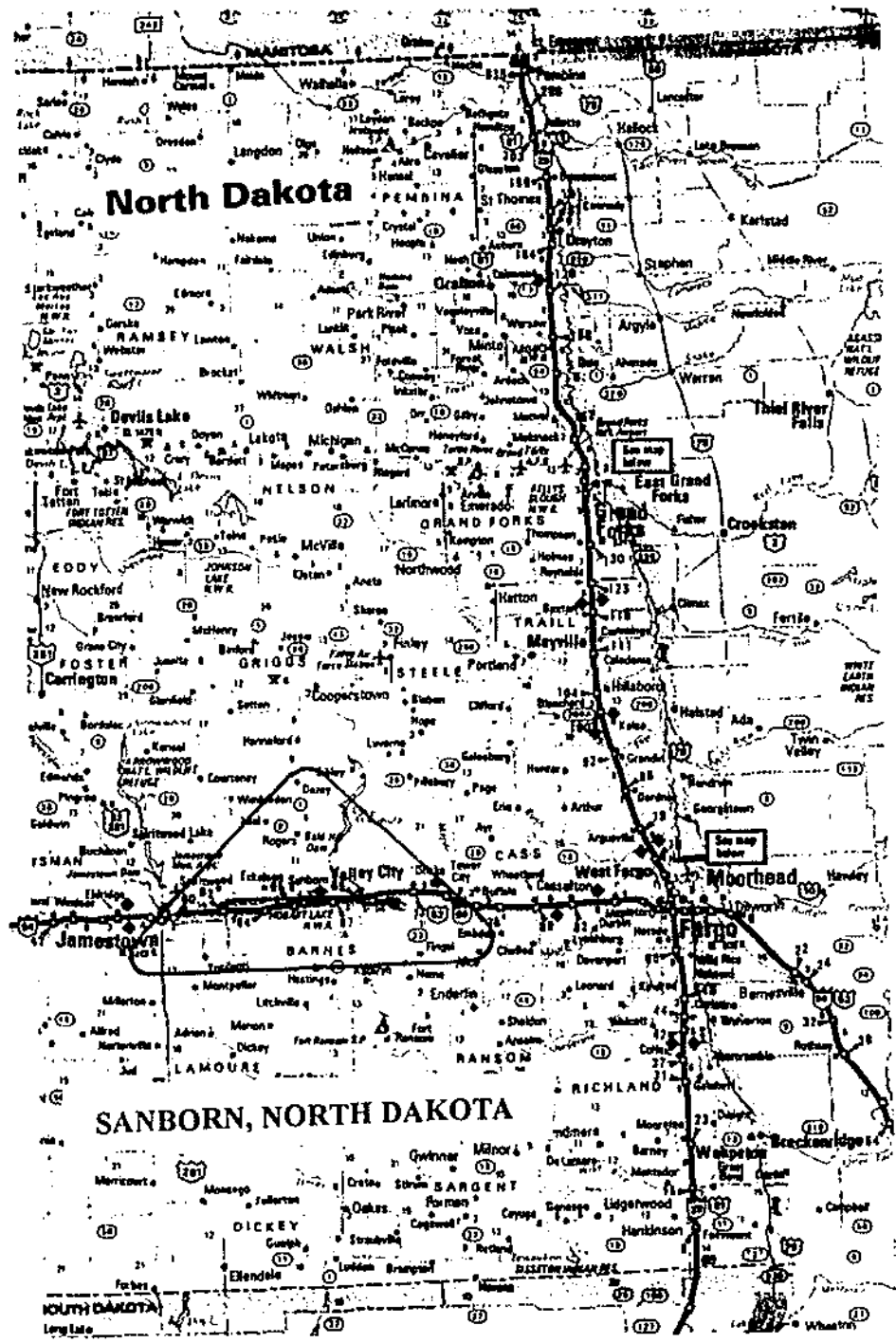

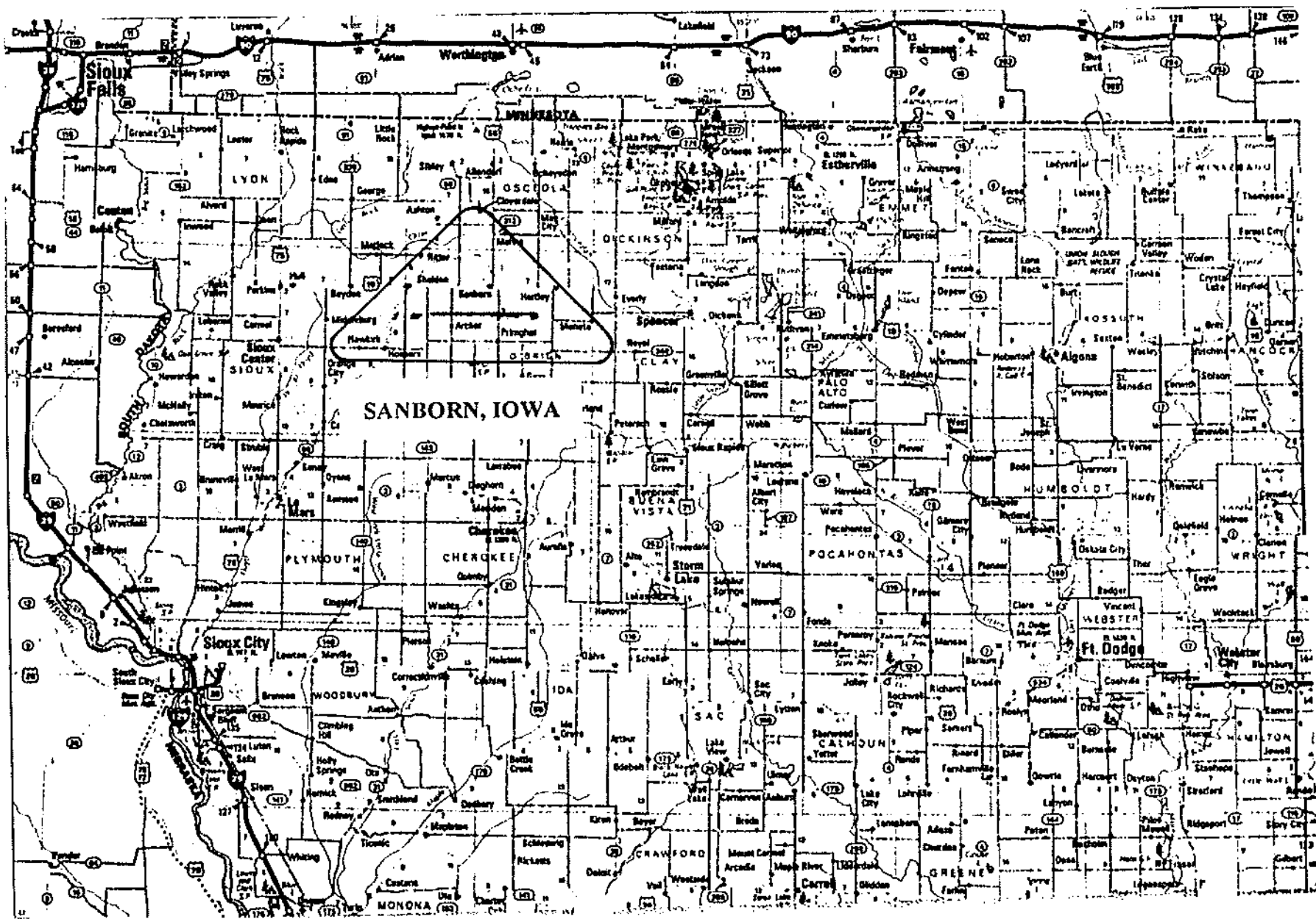
BYFIELD, MASSACHUSETTS
