## SANBORNS IN ILLINOIS—PART II

### John and Mehitabel (Sanborn) Sanborn

Part I (*Sanborn Signatures*, Spring 1999, vol XV, issue 2, pp1-3) addressed two Sanborn lines. First was John Sanborn (VCS #929) of Salisbury NH, his wife Mehitabel Sanborn (VCS #358, ix), and their 5 children. Second was John Taylor Sanborn (VCS #1200), his wife Susan Hubbard, and their 11 children.

Without repeating each VCS entry, Part II is an effort to identify the Sanborns with ties to English Prairie IL.

Abraham Sanborn (VCS #53) and Abigail Clifford had 10 children; John Sanborn (VCS #142) was their second born son. John was b 19 Feb 1741 in Kingston NH. He mar sometime before 1759 Elizabeth Sargent, b 22 Dec 1738, Chester, Rockingham Co NH. Elizabeth d 6 April 1832, perhaps in Sandown NH. VCS states John d 10 April 1797; another source gives the date of death as 31 Dec 1828. Of John & Elizabeth's 7 children, only one, Winthrop Sanborn (VCS #359), is buried in the Sanborn-Orvis Cemetery, Spring Grove IL.

Winthrop Sanborn (VCS #359) was the third of the 7 children of John & Elizabeth (Sargent) Sanborn. He was b 11 Jan 1761 in Sandown NH and fought in an Eastern Militia during the Revolutionary War. Winthrop was 26 years old when he married Betsey Fitz on 6 March 1787. Betsey was b 26 Jan 1766, probably in Salisbury NH. Winthrop d 24 Feb 1843 in Burton IL and was buried in the Sanborn-Orvis Cemetery in nearby Spring Grove. Betsey d sometime after 1808, their last child being born 28 Dec 1808 in Salisbury NH. Winthrop and Betsey had 7 children, all born in Salisbury NH.

- (1) Elizabeth Sanborn, b 1788, d an infant.
- (2) Elizabeth Sanborn, b 11 May 1790; m Stephen Hobbs of Wilmot NH.
- (3) John Sanborn (VCS #929) described in Part I.
- (4) Ira Sanborn (VCS #359, iv), b 8 Nov 1798. He moved to Bainbridge GA and mar Susan Woodson in Bainbridge. Ira became very wealthy and later returned to Salisbury NH where he d in 1865.
- (5) Sarah Sanborn, b 7 Oct 1802; mar George Shaw of Salisbury.
- (6) Daniel Sanborn (VCS #359, vi), b 3 Feb 1804; mar Clarissa Heard and he may have d in IA or MI?
- (7) Winthrop Sargent Sanborn (VCS #359, vii), b 22 Dec 1808. It appears he may have joined his brother, Ira, in GA?

The little English Prairie Cemetery is privately supported by families who contribute to the upkeep and security. Della Richardson Medley writes an *English Prairie Cemetery Newsletter*, provided to people whose family members are buried there. There are 165 burials recorded in this cemetery. Among these are the following Sanborns:

John Winthrop Sanborn (VCS #1673) (son of John Sanborn [VCS #929] and Mehitabel Sanborn [VCS #358, ix]), b 28 Dec 1842 in Burton, McHenry Co IL. John Winthrop was a GAR veteran, Co H, 95th IL Volunteers. He first mar Olive Walker (b 13 July 1846 in Geneva IL?) on 22 May 1868. Olive d date uncertain, English Prairie, and is buried in English Prairie Cemetery, A3, lot E1. John Winthrop then mar Katherine Shotliff. He d 16 Jan 1920, English Prairie, and is in the same cemetery, A1, lot E48. John Winthrop and Olive had at least 8 children, all born in English Prairie:

- (1) Clyde Walker Sanborn, b 26 May 1869, d 12 Feb 1913.
- (2) Harry Winthrop Sanborn, b 27 Aug 1870, d unknown.
- (3) George Humphrey Sanborn, b 24 Dec 1871, d 18 Aug 1872, buried English Prairie Cemetery, A4, lot E48.
- (4) Mabel F (Franklin?) Sanborn, b 11 Feb 1873, mar 20 Sep 1896, her first cousin, Charles Clarence Orvis, son of Samuel Levi Orvis & Lavinia (Sanborn [VCS #929, i]) Orvis (see Part I). Clarence was b in Burton Township IL and became an attorney in Oskaloosa IA. It is unknown where Mabel & Clarence died or are buried.
- (5) Bertie Sanborn, b 23 Aug 1874, d unk.
- (6) Guy Chelsea Sanborn, b 8 June 1876, d unk.
- (7) Edith Lilian Sanborn, b 17 Feb 1878. Retired Chicago school teacher. She d 15 Oct 1966, Woodstock IL, and is buried in English Prairie Cemetery.
- (8) Wade Hampton Sanborn, b 29 Oct 1879, d unk.

John Winthrop and his second wife, Katherine, had one known son, also named John Winthrop Sanborn, of whom nothing else is known. They had one daughter: Olive May Sanborn, b 2 March 1907, d 13 Mar 1907, buried English Prairie Cemetery, A6, lot E48.

## GEORGE C SANBORN OF WALDO ME

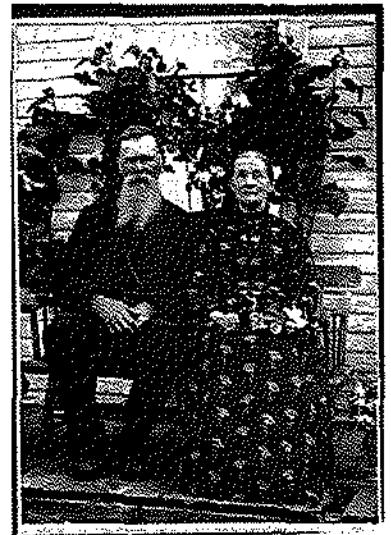
*Barbara Sanborn Chapman*

[Editor's note: A query in the Spring 1999 Sanborn Signatures about the spouses of the children of George C Sanborn elicited a reply from his great granddaughter, Barbara Chapman. She has collected the following information from documents & family members.]

George C Sanborn (VCS #1465) was born in Waldo ME 9 July 1825, the son of David (VCS #753) & Patience (Getchell) Sanborn. He was the 4th of 9 children, and the first son. He lived all his life in the Waldo homestead built by his father and to this day his great granddaughter still lives there.

George married Elvira Peabody of Thomaston ME 4 July 1840 and they had 12 children, 10 of whom survived to adulthood. All grew up in the Waldo homestead. Their children were:

- 1) Charles L; b 30 April 1851; mar Iantha A Mixer.
- 2) George Sylvanus (called Vane); b 31 July 1852; mar Angie Anthony.
- 3) Lucy E; b 20 Nov 1854; mar 1st Alden Achorn, mar 2d Holis Payson.
- 4) Oren; b 12 July 1856, d age 2.
- 5) Alice M; b 26 April 1858; mar George Perkins.
- 6) Olive G; b 29 June 1860; mar Jesse Peabody.
- 7) Harry B; b 18 July 1862. After marrying Ida Gurney

in 1888 he moved to MT then later to Yakima WA.

- 8) Rosa; b 29 April 1864, d at 9 months.
- 9) Frank Leslie; b 21 Dec 1865. He worked as a fireman in Springfield MA. After marrying Effie Hurlburt of Portland CT 31 Dec 1890, he moved to Portland where he spent his remaining years. He and his wife had one son, Frank Leslie Jr.
- 10) David A; b 28 Jan 1868. He went West to seek his fortune and was never heard from again.
- 11) Ralph E; b 12 Sep 1871; mar Mattie Smith.
- 12) Margie A; b 8 Oct 1873. She married Henry Gurney in 1895 and they had 7 children. She inherited the house in Waldo and her granddaughter still lives there.

Frank Leslie's son, Frank Leslie Sanborn Jr, married Bertha Stemmler of Portland CT and they had 7 children, 5 of whom still live in Portland CT. Frank and Bertha had 33 grandchildren and 52 great grandchildren.

## FROM THE GENEALOGIST'S CORNER

*George F Sanborn Jr*  
**Unsolved Mysteries**

In my work revising and updating the Sanborn genealogy for eventual publication by The Sanborn Family Association, I sometimes come across individuals who seem to have gone missing. From time to time I shall write about them in this column for two reasons: first, someone might have discovered some information about them; and second, it is good to get the problems out in the open with all available evidence and information so that everyone, including the Genealogist, can see what information we have, and that may suggest new avenues of pursuit for further research. It is also good to leave a record behind of these problems and what we have been able to do to resolve them.

Daniel Sanborn

By now we all know that our Sanborn family is one which really does descend from three brothers, Stephen, John, and William Samborne, who came to Hampton NH to live by 27 November 1639 when one of the brothers, William (probably the youngest), was chosen to ring the meeting-house bell on Sundays and at other times. Many New England families have vague traditions of descending from one of "three brothers," but in our case, it's true!

Getting a complete and accurate list of the children of each of our three brothers is a bit of a challenge, however, because of incomplete records. Stephen disappears from New England records after 1654; tradition relates that he accompanied his

maternal grandfather, for whom he was named, back to England, and never returned. Nevertheless, at least one of his children was still here on 29 March 1682, as a deposition shows, raising the question of what became of Stephen's wife, Sarah (maiden name unknown), and their two other children whose births were recorded in Hampton.

The other brothers, John and William, lived and died in Hampton. The births of most, but not all, of their children were recorded in Hampton, leaving some gaps in the lists of children in both cases. John and William each left a will; unfortunately, only a very insignificant portion of John's will survives, and William's was partially destroyed (the remaining portion, evidently the first page, seems to name all his sons, but no daughters, as he evidently named all the sons first). Even the surviving portion of William's will is torn, and pieces are missing from it. Other records have enabled us to decide which unrecorded Sanborns obviously of the second generation belonged to John and which ones belonged to William, with the exception of two females, Mary and Dinah, thought to have been William's daughters because John's family was more completely recorded and he already had children born at the time these two girls were probably born (he had a daughter Mary, born 12 April 1651, whose later career is known).

Stephen's known children (the first two recorded in Hampton NH) were Sarah, born 12 June 1651 (no further record); Dorothy, born 2 March 1652/3 (no further record); and Lydia, born perhaps in Hampton about 1654 (aged 27 in her 1682 deposition in which she is called "Stephen Samborn's daughter who formerly lived at Hampton") (*Records and Files of the Quarterly Courts of Essex County, Massachusetts*. Volume VIII, 1680-1683 [Salem MA: The Essex Institute, 1921], p 329). Nothing more is found regarding Lydia, either.

Some years ago I was contacted by Miriam Inez (Elliot) Bertelson of Fremont, California, who had traced her ancestry back to an Elizabeth Sanborn, born in Virginia about 1682, a member of the Chuckatuck Monthly Meeting of Friends (Quakers), and who married there first, about 1702, Joshua Jordan, and second, in 1721, Cornelius Ratcliffe. Elizabeth was the daughter of Daniel Sanborn, a house carpenter of the Lower Parish, Isle of Wight County, Virginia, and his wife, Sarah (Copeland) Sanborn. Daniel made his will on 16 December 1711, and it was recorded on 24 November 1712, and in it he named his daughter, Elizabeth Jordan, wife of Joshua Jordan, a grandson, Sanborn Woodson, and a granddaughter, Sarah Jordan (Blanche Adams Chapman, *Wills and Administrations of Isle of Wight County, Virginia, 1647-1800* [Smithfield VA: The Author, 1938 (reprinted Baltimore, 1975)], p 51, hereafter Chapman). Daniel's wife, Sarah Copeland (who had evidently died before he made his will, as she is not named in it), was the daughter of John and Sarah



(Ratcliffe) Copeland of Isle of Wight County VA. It is likely that these Copelands were closely related to Joseph Copeland, maker of the famous Copeland Spoon, the earliest pewter known to have been made in America and recovered at Jamestown, bearing the mark, "Joseph Copeland 1675, Chuckatuck." Twelve-inch replicas are sold at Williamsburg. It is thought that Joseph was a brother of John Copeland, well known as one of the earliest Quaker evangelists in America, who arrived in Boston in 1656 on the Speedwell and who was promptly deported back to Old England, but who re-appeared in Newport RI in 1657, on the Wodehouse, and was in Boston again in 1658, where he was jailed, beaten, mutilated by having his ears cropped, and evicted to Rhode Island. He later went to Isle of Wight County VA where he settled. John and Joseph were active in the Quaker community there, which met at each other's homes until a meeting-house could be built sometime before 1675. Joseph Copeland later moved to Jamestown.

Numerous records of land transactions involving Daniel Sanborn have been published, including one dated 30 Jan 1684/5, whose principals were other people but which was witnessed by "Dan. Sanbourne" and "Mary Sanbourne" (John Bennett Boddie, *Seventeenth Century Isle of Wight County, Virginia* [Chicago IL: The Author, 1938 (reprinted Baltimore, 1980)], p 628). This last-named Mary is presumably a mistake for Sarah, which names I have found interchanged on other occasions.

Mrs Bertelson, of course, was looking for Daniel Sanborn's origin, and wondered whether he might fit into the New Hampshire family somehow. Besides explaining the connection historically of the Copelands to New England, Mrs Bertelson also pointed out that other surnames found in New England appear in the early records of Chuckatuck Monthly Meeting and other places in seventeenth-century coastal Virginia and Carolina.

Elizabeth Sanborn, daughter of Daniel and Sarah (Copeland) Sanborn, was born probably in Isle of Wight County VA, say before 1682, and married first, say 1702, Joshua Jordan. She married second, as widow Elizabeth Jordan, on 23: 9mo: 1721, Cornelius Ratcliffe. Joshua Jordan's will, stating that he died on 28 Feb 1717, names his mother-in-law, Sarah Sanborn; his wife, Elizabeth; daughters Sarah, Rachel, Mary, Elizabeth, Margaret, and Susanna; sons Mathew and Joshua; and an unborn child (Chapman, p 58).

Mary Sanborn, daughter of Daniel and Sarah (Copeland) Sanborn, was born probably in Isle of Wight County VA, say before 1687, and married soon after 9: 11mo: 1706/7, Joseph Woodson. On that date, Daniel Sanborn gave his permission for Mary to marry (William Wade Hinshaw, *Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy* [Ann Arbor MI: The Author, 1950], p 36).

While the Jordans and their descendants are seen later in local Isle of Wight County records, it is interesting that the Woodsons are not. They perhaps lived in Henrico County VA where the surname is found, and where Sanborn Woodson was living in 1732 and 1734 (Priscilla Harriss Cabell, *Turf & Twig, Volume One, The French Lands* [Richmond VA: The Author, 1988], pp 67, 390)

#### Speculation

If Daniel Sanborn was aged at least 21 by 13: 8mo: 1678 when a Friends meeting was held at his house in Isle of Wight County VA, he was born about 1657. He was probably older than 21, however, and already married in 1678, which could push his date of birth back to 1648, let's say, if he was 30 in 1678. If Daniel was a son of Stephen Samborne, he would have either preceded Stephen's daughter Sarah, or followed Dorothy. If Daniel was a son of John Samborne, he would have been born before 12 Apr 1651, when John's first recorded child was born (we know there was at least one child whose birth before 1651 was not recorded). Even though there is a gap in John's children between 20 Nov 1662 and 27 Jan 1665/6, this would be too late to accommodate our Daniel of Virginia. While the births of all of William Samborne's children are not recorded in Hampton, either, all his sons seem to have been named in the surviving portion of his will. I should add here that John's son, Nathaniel, had a son named Daniel, but the name does not show up otherwise among the Hampton Sanborns until later.

#### Stray Sambornes with Southern Connections

Dame Elizabeth Dale of London, who with her husband formerly lived in Virginia, by her will dated 4 July 1640 and proved 2 December 1640, disposed of her property in England, Virginia, and elsewhere, a moiety of some of which she bequeathed to the children of Sir William Throckmorton and one William Samborne, who perhaps never left England (Henry F Waters, *Genealogical Gleanings in England*, in two volumes [Boston MA: New-England Historic Genealogical Society, 1901] , Vol 1, pp 748-749). As well, Jacques LeBas of Caen, France, son of Jean LeBas and Anne Samborne, his wife (formerly of England), settled among the French and Swiss Huguenots at Charleston SC. Neither of these references is thought to be relevant to the matter at hand, however.

#### Summation

So, why do I think Daniel Sanborn of Isle of Wight County VA might belong to the New Hampshire family? It is chiefly because of the spelling of his surname. "Sanborn," the prevailing spelling of the name in New England, seems to have been a local Hampton NH corruption of the English surname Samborne. Variations are seen, such as Sanbourne, Sanburn, Sandborn, etc. How or why this change from



Samborne occurred is not known, but it seems unlikely the same phenomenon would have occurred spontaneously somewhere else.

#### Question

Who was Daniel Sanborn and where does he belong? If he fits into the NH family at all, he was probably a son of either Stephen or John Samborne and not a son of William. Perhaps some careful searching in VA sources will help solve this mystery. The Virginia State Archives in Richmond has an important collection known as the Fillmore Norfleet Papers, some of which are the papers of the Riddick family of Nansmond County, next to Isle of Wight County. Perhaps those, or others dealing with Isle of Wight County and nearby Chuckatuck, would help. Published sources such as deeds, probate records, and vestry minutes, might also help. Are there any members with access to these materials who might be able to assist? Photocopies gratefully received!

### SANBORNS OF MONTERREY, MEXICO

*[Editor's note: In response to the item with the above name in the Fall 1999 Sanborn Signatures, I received an email from Don Sanborn (SFA Life member), one of the authors of the original article, "Sanborns in Mexico", in the Spring 1988 issue of Sanborn Signatures. What follows is his update on that branch of the family.]*

After the business and name were sold to Walgreens and a group of Mexican investors in 1946, the department store and restaurant business took off and the firm added a dozen or so branches in Mexico City, Acapulco, and a few other places. Today there are over 100 branches of Sanborns in the Mexican republic! They even have their own website, [www.sanborns.com.mx](http://www.sanborns.com.mx), and are now wholly owned by a Mexican investor group (Grupo Mexico) headed by Carlos Slim. A Spanish-language book giving the history of the business is currently making its appearance in Mexico. I assisted in its preparation. *[Editor's note: be patient when you logon to this web site; it is slow to load. It does have an English language web site.]*

As for the descendants of the original Sanborn brothers, Walter D Sanborn & Frank A Sanborn, both originally from Los Angeles, their sons, grandchildren, and great grandchildren, many of whom were born in Mexico City, have settled in various cities in the USA. None live in the Republic of Mexico.

Frank A Sanborn's 2 sons, Jack and Francis, fathered John (deceased), Donald (myself), Pancho (deceased), and Dorothy.

John Sanborn's children, Richard, Gail & Laurie, all live in TX, and among them have 7 children. Donald (myself), who just moved to southern AZ from HI, had one child, Laura, who lives in St Louis with her 2 children, Toby and Tiana. Pancho had 2 children, Frank Allen, who lives in Olympia WA, and Marilee, who lives in the Dallas area with her 2 children, Don & Sandi. Sandi has one child, a daughter, Taylor.

Walter D Sanborn had one son, Walter Jr. He fathered Walter III & Thomas. Thomas lives in Oakland CA, while Walter III lives in Poway CA. Walter III has 2 children, Deanna, who lives in Philadelphia, and Tom, who lives in Newport Beach CA. Interesting to note that not one of the descendants has gone into the restaurant and department store business!

As far as I know, the "Sanborns of Monterrey," Mexico, referred to in the item, still exists. There is another Sanborn also active in Mexico, Dan Sanborn Insurance. We are not related except perhaps way back in colonial times. He, or his successors as Dan passed away over a year ago, is a member of the SFA.

### PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

I want to start out by expressing a sincere and special thank you to the folk who are on the Sanborn Family Association Board. Without the dedication, time, and efforts of the members of this board, you would not have an SFA. Then, too, I must also say thank you for the cadre of "cousins" that over the past years have built and nurtured this organization to what it is now. Neither do I wish to neglect to acknowledge those of you who have attended our reunions regularly and faithfully over the years. Some of you folk have made an impressive attendance record! And lastly, but certainly not "leastly", I welcome you new members for whom this Sanborn Signatures may be your first.

My period of activity with the SFA has been both interesting and exciting. Getting acquainted with "cousins" and "cousins of cousins" has been a real pleasure and indeed rewarding. My plans for the future, however, do not include another year as president.

For the past year and a half, I have been making an effort to render the data contained in many hundreds of the "Personal Lineage Charts" in the SFA Archives into a more useful and accessible form. This effort consists of entering the data from the PLC charts and accompanying papers into an integrated database using a Personal Computer and a suitable program. At this time, we have in the database nearly 9000 names with



related vital records, date, and place data integrated into a completely connected chain descended from Lieut John Samborne through 11 to 13 generations. These data represent the content of an estimated one third of the PLCs that are now in my possession. This effort is on going with some additions being made each week. It is hoped that this database will be useful for individuals researching their Sanborn relations and for the updating and correcting activities that will be needed in the next few years.

The SFA will be entering the twenty-first century with its international membership facing a job cut out for it. That job is and will be making a good SFA into a better SFA.

Some of the things to be considered are:

- (1) The need to have a good, interesting, and dynamic web site, featuring our purposes and goals. The initial site is already in the works [see the Editor's Column] and will be under the direction of our webmaster, Charlie Watson. SFA member, Glen Hawkins of Hawkins Design, Boston MA, is doing the development work.
- (2) We need to revise our by-laws and Corporate Objectives in order to become the recipient of tax exempt donations. This effort is now underway under the direction of our Board member and legal consultant, Michael Donnelly, and the Planning Committee.
- (3) The 100 year old Sanborn genealogy by V C Sanborn needs to be updated and corrected with information made available since its publication. Research into our English roots needs to be continued in order to uncover solid evidence of our roots in the past.
- (4) The SFA needs more participation and input from members outside New England. One of the ways that this might be accomplished is to encourage the establishment of a regional or state reporting plan whereby the SFA members in a state or region would establish a member as a spokesperson whose duties would be to provide news articles of interest to the Sanborn Signatures editor for publishing and distribution to all members. Perhaps a competition could be developed that would offer an incentive for members to submit historical or biographical writings for Sanborn Signatures, with the winner receiving a prize such as a life membership in the SFA.

"Nick also worked with us to revive the Hall of Fame," Van Dyke said. "He also was very proud of the Hill Climb Museum, too, and was just a very likeable and personable man. We'll miss him." Sanborn, who was born at the base of Pikes Peak in Colorado Springs on 18 May 1935, also worked as the director of race communications for CART for several years. He was a graduate of Manitou Springs High School and served on the school board. For the past 2 years, Sanborn had gone from the mountain to the plains, working as a consultant for the Pikes Peak International Raceway in Fountain. ### SFA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Board of Directors has formally approved the rules for awarding the SFA Scholarship Award. The first awards will be made at the SFA Annual Meeting in August 2000. Two awards of \$100 each will be made: one High School and one Post High School. Please read the Rules given below and either 1) fill in the form found at the end of the rules, or 2) simply write a letter with the required details. Send the application to the SFA Secretary, Priscilla Watts, 52 Range Road, Deerfield NH 03037.

### RULES OF THE SFA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

**A – Awards:** 1) There shall be 2 awards annually: a) 1 award shall be for individuals at a high school level; b) 1 award shall be for individuals at a post high school level (college, vocational-technical school, graduate school, etc.).

**B – Criteria for Award – High School Level:** 1) Applicant must be accepted to and plan to attend a public or private high school. 2) Applicant must be: a) an active member of the SFA; or b) covered by an active family membership in the SFA; or c) the immediate relative of an active member of the SFA. 3) If the applicant is under 18 years of age, a parent or guardian must also sign the application.



**C – Criteria for Award – Post High School Level:** 1) Applicant must be accepted to and plan to attend a college, vocational-technical school, graduate school, or other form of post high school education. 2) & 3) same as High School Level above.

**D – Scholarship Committee:** 1) The Scholarship Committee shall be composed of 1 or more active members of the SFA, at least 1 member of which shall be a member of the Board of Directors. 2) No member of the Scholarship Committee shall take part in the solicitation, collection or selection of scholarship applicants if a member of their family has applied or intends to apply. 3) In the event that no member of the Scholarship Committee is able to participate in the solicitation, collection or selection of scholarship applicants, the Board of Directors shall vote upon sufficient numbers of eligible replacement members.

**E – Application Records:** 1) All application records shall be maintained for one year after the awarding of the scholarships.

**F – Application Procedure:** 1) A form will be published in Sanborn Signatures, requesting the following information: a) Name of applicant; b) educational institute attending during the following school year; c) address of applicant; d) address of educational institute; e) name of closest related active mem-

ber; f) affirmation [I affirm that the information contained in this application is true to the best of my knowledge] with signature of applicant or parent/guardian and date. 2) Applicant shall submit a legible, completed form, or reasonable facsimile to the Secretary of the corporation before midnight of the last Sunday before the Annual Meeting. 3) Each applicant shall be assigned a number by the Scholarship Committee. 4) During the Annual Meeting, a container holding all the numbers of that year's High School applicants shall be presented to the membership and a single number shall be drawn by an eligible member of the Scholarship Committee. 5) During the Annual Meeting, a container holding all the numbers of that year's Post High School applicants shall be presented to the membership and a single number shall be drawn by an eligible member of the Scholarship Committee. 6) The applicant need not be present to be awarded the scholarship.

**G – Scholarship Funds:** 1) Scholarship funds shall be administered by and monitored by the Treasurer. 2) Scholarship funds are not to be commingled with any other monies of the SFA. 3) Misuse of scholarship funds shall result in administrative action by the Board of Directors, and, if warranted, criminal actions by the proper authorities. 4) Possible misuse of scholarship funds shall be investigated by an independent investigator, employed by the Board of Directors.
