COMPUTERS AND FAMILY HISTORY

Jim Sanborn Davidson

Last August I offered a program at the SFA Annual Meeting on the use of the computer, especially the internet, for family history research. I was asked to provide a summary of that program session for Sanborn Signatures.

As I prepared to respond to that request it became apparent that things move so quickly in the computer world that it required a relatively new presentation. It is not that many basic premises are not still valid but much technological advance is taking place.

Do you have a computer program in which to store your research results? There is a whole range of such programs with varying costs for the software. Some, which are freeware or shareware, are at little or no cost. Remember that when you pay for a professionally developed commercial program you should get continuing professional support and future development. Freeware and shareware may not guarantee you that. There is also a great range of sophistication to individual needs. How complex a program do you need? When evaluating a program, make sure that it is GEDCOM file compatible. GEDCOM is simply a file compatibility that you will want. It enables you to transfer your old files from one program to another. With GEDCOM compatibility you can move your files from an old program to a new one, as new and better programs become available. And new programs will come along.

On the other hand you may want to keep your records the "old-fashioned way". There are web sites where you can download forms to use.

If you are to make profitable use of computers you must try programs and web sites personally in order to evaluate their benefit to your family research. Many of you realize that there are vast riches but they seem hidden and inaccessible to the average person. One of the biggest problems that beginners have is getting at the material. For a moment I would like to get you started toward finding the riches. Once you get there you will find all sorts of good things.

If you do not have a computer, go to your local library or visit a friend with a computer. They need to have on-line access that most computer users have today. Choose a search engine or browser like "Yahoo" and do a search for the term "genealogy". Look at the results. Click on the first category, "Genealogy". You should get "Beginners Guides". Click on "Beginners Guides" and you should get "Cyndi's List How To". Click on that and then scroll down to "Software & Computers" and click. At this point you may want to bookmark this site for future ease of access.

If you wish to go directly to "Cyndi's list", search for www.cyndislist.com. Then click on "Cyndi's List" which brings you to the home page. Click on "Alphabetical Index". Click on "B". Find "Beginners" and click. Scroll down the page to "How To" and click. Scroll down to "Software & Computers" and click.

As you scroll down the "Category Index for this page" you will find the following:

1. Articles & Reviews

- a. Take a look at "The Genealogical Software Reportcard" by clicking on it. By clicking on "ReportCards" you can get a large choice of programs whose report cards you can consider. Click "back" to "Articles & Reviews".
- b. Take a look at "Genealogy Software – Freeware/Shareware" by clicking on it. Scroll down the page and select items in which you are interested. Click "back" to "Articles & Reviews".
- c. Take a look at "Genealogy Software Springboard" by clicking on it. Click on "Windows software". Then select programs from the list on the left. Click to open. This program includes prices.

2. CD-ROMs are a new hot source for genealogical data. Prices are still high in some situations but if you shop around you can find some very reasonable buys. Some CD-ROMs are databases that are searchable by computer. Others are scanned images of the original, which require some other method of indexing. Here the trade-off is between the advantage of computer-searchable vs. using a scan of the original document that you can blow-up and examine in some detail. CD-ROMs can hold up to 160,000 pages of data. Some may cost \$40 - \$50 a disk. Others can be obtained for \$10. Libraries are beginning to hold CD-ROMs for patron use. There are membership web sites like Ancestry.com where your membership can gain you access to CD-ROMs. Sometimes this is a better trade-off. Each individual situation varies. If you click on this item you will be able to scroll down a huge number of CD-ROM possibilities. Click on those that interest you for further information.

3. Genealogy Software programs is an area that you should click on. Then scroll down through a large list of items for any that may interest you.

4. Genealogy Tools & Utilities is another area that deserves your scrolling through the individual items. One that deserves your attention is "Clooz" which is an electronic filing cabinet for genealogical records.

5. "Genealogy Web Page/Site Generators" is a category for those who are contemplating setting up a web site or page. You should also consider setting up your family site on one of the free locations available on some of the genealogical sites.

6. "Miscellaneous Software" has a few interesting pieces like genealogical clip art and date calculators.

There are a number of on-line sites that are specifically geared to family history information. Some like Ancestry.com are sites that require a modest fee for some services. Other services are free. One of the free services from this site is the MyFamily.com free family site. RootsWeb.com and USGenWeb.com are free sites. RootsWeb hosts a number of free sites as well as selling CD-ROMs. Check out the range of information available from there. RootsWeb has recently merged with MyFamily.com (sponsored by Ancestry.com) to provide financial stability. RootsWeb will continue to provide its services and to provide them free. About.com/genealogy offers free on-line genealogy classes as well as a wide range of other genealogical materials. GenSource which can be linked from About.com/genealogy is also useful. One of its services is a link to other folks searching for common ancestors. Family tree.com is also a free site with neat graphical links to many other sites.

There are many library sites throughout the world that are freely accessible. Some, like the Hampton, NH Library, have services of particular interest to family searchers. The Hampton Library site has genealogical pages that include things like early probate records. (<http://www.Hampton.lib.nh.us>). Go to this site then go to "Lane Memorial Library"; then to "About Hampton & NH"; then to "History and genealogy"; then to "Research Hampton Genealogies". You'll be pleased.

There are also family sites that are devoted to the history of a particular family. Go to your search engine and type in a search for "Sanborn Family". You will find about 14,900 web page matches. Chief among these is the Sanborn Family Genealogy Forum (<http://www.genforum.genealogy.com/sanborn/>). Of course you will also find our own Association web page there. Also check out the Surname Community at Ancestry.com. Enter "Sanborn". You'll find some interesting options. Happy searching. You are now on your

CARING FOR FAMILY PHOTOS

Family photographs are a link to the past. To ensure they will be there for future generations to enjoy, here are some steps you can take.

Make sure your photos are labeled. Many family photos end up in the trash or at antique malls because no one can identify the people, places, or events. Be careful what you use to identify your photos. Labels contain glues that can eventually eat through the photos. Inks from markers & pens are not archival safe and can cause damage. Inks also run if the photos get wet and while you can dry a photo you can't get ink off. It is suggested you mark the back of your photos with a #2 pencil using a light touch. There are pens & markers that are labeled archival safe, but read the fine print and know what you are using. Many of the current archival photo albums provide a space to use acid free/archival safe paper to label your photos.

Photographs have many enemies: improper storage, light, heat, humidity, even handling (sweat, salt, oils & dirt from our skin) can deteriorate photos.

While many people enjoy displaying family photos make sure yours are not in direct exposure to sunlight. The sunlight will fade them. Temperature fluctuations & high humidity will cause photos & negatives to stick to each other or to stick to their enclosures and it is hard to get them apart without some damage. Store your photos & negatives separately. Acid free paper enclosures are recommended for use in areas with high humidity. When you are planning for photo storage, select a system that will work for you but make sure it is archival safe. Read the labels and if it is not marked "acid free" or "archival safe" don't buy it. Avoid PVC (Polyvinylchloride) plastic enclosures, rubber cement (sometimes used for mounting photos, glassine paper, cling "magnetic" photo albums (both the plastic cover & the glue backing are damaging to the photos). These products will shorten the life of your photos. For example, a black & white photo owned by the Rutland Historical Society is being eaten by the rubber cement that was used to adhere a label on the back of the photo 30 years ago.

Remember one of the main rules of archival practice is: Don't do anything that can't be undone.

Proper care & good labeling will ensure future generations will enjoy your family photographs.

I read in the recent newsletter the article about The Sanborn Foundation of Arlington Massachusetts. Perhaps you would



like a bit more information. The Foundation was established by my great grandfather, George Lowe Sanborn, February 03, 1858 – January 24, 1938, born in Tamworth NH and died in Arlington MA. He is buried in St. Paul's Cemetery, Arlington MA. George married first, Catherine Frances O'Brien, and they had two children, Franklin Joseph Sanborn and Helen Beatrice Sanborn. He married second, Elizabeth Sullivan, and he married third, Edith Birmingham.

George Lowe Sanborn was the only surviving child of Joel Sawyer Sanborn and Sarah E. Roberts Lowe Sanborn of Tamworth NH. This is my brick wall as I cannot find the parents/siblings of Joel Sawyer Sanborn. Elizabeth Sullivan Sanborn died of cancer, June 06, 1931, and the Foundation was established in their names. Five children were born to them: Lewis, who died in infancy; Wm. H., who died last September; Mrs. Vilas Follett, of Coloma Station, Mrs. A. Caves, of South Hancock, and Mrs. Jas. Spalding, of



Richfield. She also left a sister, who lives in New Hampshire, and a brother, Thomas Sanborn, of La Crosse, who was present at the funeral, which was held from the old homestead near Coloma Corners, the services being conducted by Rev. SFA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Board of Directors has formally approved the rules for awarding the SFA Scholarship Award. The second awards will be made at the SFA Annual Meeting in July 2001. Two awards of \$100 each will be made: one High School and one Post High School. Please read the Rules given below and send a letter with the required details to the SFA Secretary, Priscilla Watts, 52 Range Road, Deerfield NH 03037.

RULES OF THE SFA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

- A – Awards: 1) There shall be 2 awards annually: a) 1 award shall be for individuals at a high school level; b) 1 award shall be for individuals at a post high school level (college, vocational-technical school, graduate school, etc.).
- B – Criteria for Award – High School Level: 1) Applicant must be accepted to and plan to attend a public or private high school. 2) Applicant must be: a) an active member of the SFA; or b) covered by an active family membership in the SFA; or c) the immediate relative of an active member of the SFA. 3) If the applicant is under 18 years of age, a parent or guardian must also sign the application.
- C – Criteria for Award – Post High School Level: 1) Applicant must be accepted to and plan to attend a college, vocational-technical school, graduate school, or other form of post high school education. 2) & 3) same as High School Level above.
- D – Scholarship Committee: 1) The Scholarship Committee shall be composed of 1 or more active members of the SFA, at least 1 member of which shall be a member of the Board of Directors. 2) No member of the Scholarship Committee shall take part in the solicitation, collection or selection of scholarship applicants if a member of their family has applied or intends to apply. 3) In the event that no member of the Scholarship Committee is able to participate in the solicitation, collection or selection of scholarship applicants, the Board of Directors shall vote upon sufficient numbers of eligible replacement members.
- E – Application Records: 1) All application records shall be maintained for one year after the awarding of the scholarships.
- F – Application Procedure: 1) A form was published in the Spring 2000 Sanborn Signatures, requesting the following information: a) Name of applicant; b) educational institute attending during the following school year; c) address of applicant; d) address of educational institute; e) name of closest related active member; f) affirmation [I affirm that the information contained in this application is true to the best of my knowledge] with signature of applicant or parent/guardian and date. 2) Applicant shall submit a legible, completed form, or reasonable facsimile to the Secretary of the corporation before midnight of the last Sunday before the Annual Meeting. 3) Each applicant shall be assigned a number by the Scholarship Committee. 4) During the Annual Meeting, a container holding all the numbers of that year's High School applicants shall be presented to the membership and a single number shall be drawn by an eligible member of the Scholarship Committee. 5) During the Annual Meeting, a container holding all the numbers of that year's Post High School applicants shall be presented to the membership and a single number shall be drawn by an eligible member of the Scholarship Committee. 6) The applicant need not be present to be awarded the scholarship.
- G – Scholarship Funds: 1) Scholarship funds shall be administered by and monitored by the Treasurer. 2) Scholarship funds are not to be commingled with any other monies of the SFA. 3) Misuse of scholarship funds shall result in administrative action by the Board of Directors, and, if warranted, criminal actions by the proper authorities. 4) Possible misuse of scholarship funds shall be investigated by an independent investigator, employed by the Board of Directors.
