RECOLLECTIONS OF SEVENTY YEARS

[Editor's note: this is a continuation of the lead article in the Spring 2002 "Sanborn Signatures" in which I quoted extracts from a book by F B Sanborn of Concord MA, "Recollections of Seventy Years", published in 2 volumes in 1909. Much of the book deals with national politics and the many important and influential people he met. For the most part I shall omit the 'national' scene except his friendship with John Brown of Harper's Ferry fame and the consequences of that friendship for Sanborn. Whenever you see 3 dots, material has been omitted. Any additions by the editor will be in square brackets; original page numbers will also be in square brackets. Beginning on page 20, Sanborn relates the political character of NH politics and how, as a teenager, he followed his father in supporting the Democratic party. That party in NH split in the late 1840s with Sanborn becoming a supporter of the Independent Democrats because of its anti-annexation and anti-slavery policies.]

[page 30] All the political literature of the dismal years of the Mexican War and the territorial agitations that followed were well known to me in specimens – for nobody could possibly read it all; and my mind was fully made up on the main question. That slavery was wrong, that we of the North were governed by a minority small in numbers but powerful in wealth and influence, made up of the slaveholders and their commercial and manufacturing allies at the North and West, and that the mass of the people must free themselves from this dominating aristocracy, were truths that appealed to my naturally democratic sentiments so early that I hardly remember when I thought otherwise. ... I was instinctively of the faith that our national Constitution was an anti-slavery document ... as in fact it proved to be, when the revolt of the slave States forced upon the nation the alternative of [31] emancipation or the destruction of national existence.

Although this was the turn of my mind, it was, of course, only gradually that I came to clear ideas on the subject. These ideas were much promoted by two or three strong influences. One was the National Era, a weekly journal published at Washington, in which Whittier, Mrs. Stowe, and other good writers maintained the attitude of the voting emancipationists; another was Horace Greeley's Tribune, which, while adhering to the Whig party as long as it could, yet dealt the most trenchant blows at the monster of misgovernment which then controlled affairs in the United States. Another influence, and in my case the strongest, was the tenor of all good literature, of which I became very early and have long continued to be a general student. All literature worthy of the name is and must be on the side of freedom, though it may also be a maintainer of reasonable

authority. For without freedom no good literature can be born or long exist. The poets are on the side of freedom, and the virtues and graces are so, too.

My way of life at home on the farm, and the studies I pursued, were such as to foster an original turn of thought. The labor I performed was not hard, nor oppressive in its continuance; it was often solitary labor in the field or the woods, leaving the mind free to entertain its own thoughts. So far as it was social, or performed in the company of others, it promoted conversation, and gave a ready mind access to all that store of homely wit [32] and natural fact which was put to such wonderful use by Abraham Lincoln, who picked it up, as I did in a smaller way, by listening to the talk and noticing the ways of the countryside. Following the mowers in the hay-field, or sitting with parents and brothers and neighbors under an apple tree in summer, or beside a fire of boughs in the winter grove, what snatches of wit and wisdom have I not heard! Grinding scythes, repairing roads, making shoes or tools in the little shops, the best part of unconscious education may be acquired from remarks made and pondered, the debates carried on, and the anecdotes related. I was never very shy or unsocial, made friends easily, and was tolerated or praised by elders, and never thought myself, so far as I remember, the most important person in any company, large or small, where I found myself. A husking-party, a game of checkers or of cards, a stroll in the pastures with young comrades, bearing guns and enlivened by dogs, tea parties and school examinations, and evening debates in the district schoolhouse – such and a hundred other occasions for learning and practicing social good humor and the untaught lore of human nature, formed my character, such as it is, and made me, I dare say, a fair representative of myriads of my New England countrymen. In one thing I perhaps differed – in freedom from avarice or ambition. I never yearned for great wealth, nor sought for leadership or high place in the world; such leadership as I may have had (and most men of education take the lead in something) must have [33] come from character, not from ambition. But along with this contentment in the station I have had went a firm resolve not to be domineered over by others, either individuals or classes; and I saw no reason why I should take my opinions from the majority, or the cultivated minority – or from any source except my own much-considering mind. In this, no doubt, there was a certain pride, to which respectable sin rather than to the more common quality of vanity it is likely I have been too much inclined.

[Sanborn attended Harvard University 1852-55 and moved to Concord MA in 1855 to teach school. While at Harvard he became acquainted with many of the influential people of the day. In Concord he became active in the anti-slavery movement.]

[51] I joined [in May 1856] in their [anti-slavery] movement to raise money and buy arms for our oppressed friends, the Free-State pioneers in Kansas; and I became secretary of the Town Committee of Concord, of the Middlesex County Committee, and finally, later in the year 1856, of the State Kansas Committee, which continued in existence for several years and raised much money for the cause that finally triumphed. ... As [County] secretary I conducted the correspondence, and also spent the first half of my summer vacation (1856) in driving over half of Middlesex County in a 'one-horse shay' ... [52] to organize town committees and raise money for emigrants, arms and supplies. The result was that in February, 1857, when I reported our funds to the subscribers, we had raised \$17,383 in money and supplies from a population of 195,000 then living in Middlesex, of which Concord gave \$2,242 from a population of 2,251.

In what remained of my summer vacation, I set forth, in August, 1856, as an agent of the Massachusetts State Kansas Committee (of which I was afterward secretary for some years) on a tour of inspection and consultation, that took me across the prairie States of Indiana, Illinois and Iowa, and over the Missouri River into what was then the Territory of Nebraska. ...

[Sanborn stopped in Chicago, then proceeded to Iowa City, Iowa's capital city then, and then south to Burlington IA. From there he took the train to the end of the line in Mt Pleasant IA, about 20 miles west of Burlington.]

[53] At Mount Pleasant I met one of the brothers Eldridge, whose Free-State Hotel in Lawrence, Kansas, had been cannonaded, ruined and pillaged a few months earlier by a body of [54] Missourians, among whom was Senator Atchison, lately acting Vice-President of the United States. Mr. Eldridge, seeing that I was unarmed, and without an overcoat (which at that age I seldom wore, even in winter), lent me his Colt's revolver, loaded and capped, and a green and blue plaid shawl, under which I took some agreeable naps in my night-rides inside or outside the slow stage-coaches of that time and place.

In these filthy coaches, with all sorts of companions, and lodging at all kinds of stage taverns, at all hours of the night-arrival, I traversed the 400 miles between Mount Pleasant and Council Bluffs [Iowa, on the Missouri River], in the hot August weather of that year, inspecting the land-route by which we were sending emigrants to Kansas, after the Missouri River was practically closed to them by the pro-slavery men of Missouri, who were resolved that Kansas should become a slave State. It was then a slave territory, partially colonized by slaveholders from various parts of the South, bringing a few slaves with them, and expecting to bring or see brought a great many more. ...

[56] We reached Council Bluffs in the slow stage-coach westward one August night as the red sun was setting over the Missouri Bottom and the swift river beyond it, where now stands the great city of Omaha. In 1856 a single house marked the spot, if I recollect aright. Council Bluffs was a military station of the national army, and I found there a good hotel, three or four miles from the landing of the steamboat that was to carry me down-stream to Nebraska City. A river boat was tied up there, for an evening ball, after which it would start in the night for St. Louis. I supped well at the hotel, and then, under a bright moon, in a huge stage-wagon, I found myself seated beside a handsome, black-coated Kentuckian, wearing a wide Byron collar and conspicuous shirt-cuffs. He was going to the same steamer. ... He was about my own age, and very conversable. Soon he revealed himself as George Greathouse, son of a county clerk in Kentucky ... [57] He said he was going out on the plains with his friend Foster, of the army, to shoot the buffalo, then very common in Nebraska and Kansas. *[They reached the steamboat and attended the ball, engaging each other in much conversation.]* ... Of course I did not disclose the capacity in which I was then traveling, and we avoided by mutual consent the topic of the Kansas troubles.

In the evening after the ball I left the steamer [58] at Nebraska City, bidding my Kentucky friend farewell, and not expecting to see him again, as he was to land some miles below and go out on the plains. *[Sanborn didn't have time to enter Kansas so, after conducting some business in Nebraska City, he set off by land to return north to Council Bluffs.]* We stopped at a small town, either Sidney or Tabor, in Fremont County, Iowa, for dinner, and waited there an hour or two until our horse had eaten and digested his meal. As I was strolling about the little tavern, after dinner, whom should I come upon at the stable but my Kentucky friend, with two or three horses, which he was feeding. ... I spoke to him and said, 'Why are you here, and not out on the prairie shooting buffaloes?' He hung his head, and replied, 'Down in Missouri they told me that the abolitionists are making trouble in Kansas, and I am going in with some of our men to put a stop to it.' I urged him not to do so, saying that he had better keep out of harm's way, for 'the dragoons of Uncle Sam will keep the peace there, and you will not be needed.' He said that he had promised to go in, and must keep his word. He did so, joined an invading party, and was shot in a skirmish near Franklin, in the vicinity of Lawrence. My friend Edmund Whitman, when I saw him [59] afterward in Massachusetts ... told me that he had seen Greathouse lying dead on the prairie between Lawrence and Franklin. He remembered the incident, which was not uncommon in Kansas that year, from the singularity of the man's name (Greathouse), which

he had never heard before. There were many of those who fought on the pro-slavery side, no doubt, as agreeable and as reckless as my Kentucky comrade of a single night.

[73] I returned to Concord without further adventure, and took up my school-work; but along with it the continued business of raising money and holding meetings in aid of free Kansas. In December, 1856, putting my school in charge of the late Francis Abbot, then a student at Harvard College, for a few months, I took charge myself of the State Kansas Committee's office in Niles' Building, School Street, Boston – being secretary and general agent of the committee. ... Out of this committee-work soon grew my intimacy with John Brown, of Kansas and Virginia.

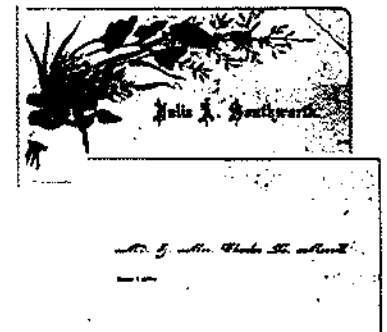
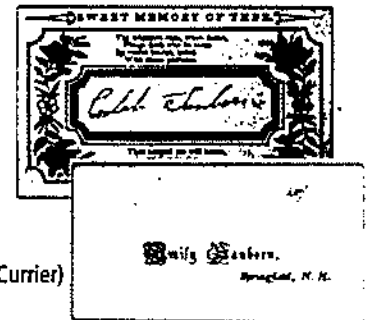
FROM SEA TO SHINING SEA

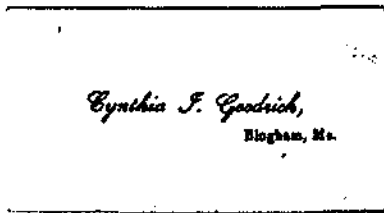
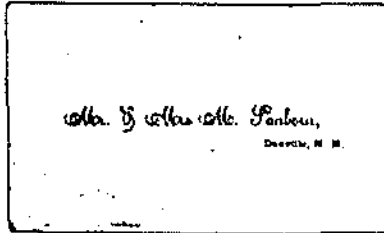

[Editor's note: here is another extension of the information in V C Sanborn, a correction & an addition; done by a great great granddaughter. This is based on marriage & death notices plus other family information. See V C Sanborn, Sanborn Genealogy, p 511, for additional details.]

William Ward Wilmarth Wheeler Sanborn [V C Sanborn # 1500 i] was born 6 Aug 1827 in Palmyra ME of Ezra Wilmarth Sanborn (born 22? Jan 1803 in Rumney NH; married 18 May 1826; died 10 Jan 1837?; in Dixmont/Canaan ME) and Sarah Ann Reed (born 1802; remarried to a Nason 1837; died 29 Apr 1884; buried Canaan Cemetery - have photo).

WWWW had two brothers, one of whom was Winthrop Washington Watson Sanborn; the other (probably Earle) was killed in the Civil War. Winthrop stayed on the old home place, married Elizabeth Fowler, & had 3 children, George, Eugene, & Orvilla.

WWWW went from Fall River MA to California, but then returned home where he married Harriet Sisson (born 30 Jan 1828 in Fall River; daughter of George Sisson & Ann of Fall River; died 9 or 19 Nov 1889 in Lyons IA) on 5 June 1854. I have a copy of the marriage certificate signed by John Hobart, Pastor. WWW's occupation was listed as carpenter and his name is written William H Sandern. They moved that September, 1854, to Lyons IA, now part of the city of Clinton.

The newly-weds lived in the white house just north of the City Hall on Fourth St in Lyons. WWW was associated with Benjamin Lake as a contractor and builder for some years, but later began the profession of architect. He specialized in designing Methodist churches and the plans were used all over the country, including 400 churches in Iowa. He also designed other public and private buildings, including the Lamb home on 7th St (now the YMCA), a court house, the Methodist Church on 6th St, offices of Lambert & Sons, and Richard Lyons' house west of Elvira. WWW was a "thorough Republican from the beginning" and held various positions in city and county governments and in the Methodist Church. He was also a deputy sheriff, president of the school board, registrar of patents, etc. He was a Mason for many years, obtaining the 32nd degree; he was several times Master of Lyons Lodge and Master of Delphic Chapter, Rose Croix of the Scottish Rite Masons. (I have a Masonic apron in very good condition that is probably his. I don't know what to do with it!)

During the last year of his life he joined his daughter Ella (Mrs H W) Lucas in Silver City NM where he died on 23 Apr



1886. Harriet survived him until 9 Nov 1889. He was buried in Oakland Cemetery in Clinton IA, escorted by 90 teams of Masons. (Burial was in lot 20, block 6, with wife Harriet, daughter Hattie Johnson, and Earle Sanborn) He was survived by his children, Nellie and Will at home, Mrs Ella Lucas, and Mrs Harriet/Hattie (Sanborn) Johnson.

Harriet Attlemond Sanborn (WWWW's daughter) was born 25 July 1855/56 in Lyons (V C Sanborn writes she died as an infant; this is an error) She married William Henry Johnson (my great grandfather, born 30 May 1852 in Syracuse NY) on 16 Mar 1875 in Lyons.

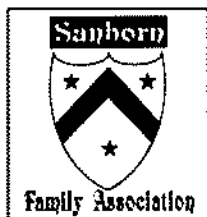
Hattie eventually went to Indianapolis and then to Chicago, where she was separated from her husband. He went on to Kalamazoo MI. The family story says that William deserted Hattie and the children and that the small family had a difficult time making ends meet in Chicago. Hattie raised her children, including my grandfather, Clyde Wilmouth Johnson, who later graduated from Northwestern University where he obtained a degree in dentistry. He married and raised a family in Lawton MI.

Hattie (Sanborn) Johnson died June 21/July 18, 1892 in Chicago or Lyons. She was buried in the family plot in Oakland Cemetery in Clinton IA. The gravestone gives the death date as 16 Aug 1892. I have several photos of Hattie/Harriet and of the lovely Sanborn home in Lyons.

SANBORN FAMILY ASSOCIATION BIENNIAL MEETING

The Yard, Londonderry NH, 2 August 2003

The Biennial Meeting for 2003 was held at the Yard Restaurant in Londonderry NH. We owe a big thank you to our Vice President, Mark Sanborn, for arranging the meeting hall for us.

The day began with registration and coffee and pastries at 9:30. Jim & Helen Davidson manned the registration table



and made sure everyone signed the guest book. Jane Donnelly took charge of setting up and arranging the scotch auction table for us. Lynda Sanborn put out a very nice display of Sanborn memorabilia. Priscilla Watts was in charge of the sales table. Roscoe Sanborn & Mark Sanborn set up and manned the computer table.

At 10:30 George Sanborn gave the group a presentation about our English Sanborns and explained the ongoing English research. George stated that our Sanborns were located in South Central England. He noted that there is only one Sanborn family left in England. We believe that we are all descended from Nicolas Sanborn but we are missing three generations. Our English research had been ongoing for 19 years. A lot of people have been ruled out. We need to be able to tie in a few more names.

After the presentation we broke for a wonderful buffet lunch put on by The Yard Restaurant. The break also gave us a chance to check out the memorabilia table, the scotch auction items, and the sales table.

At 1:30 President Everett Sanborn called the business meeting to order.

The Secretary's report was read by Secretary Priscilla Watts. On motion of Roscoe Sanborn, seconded by Jim Davidson, the Secretary's report was accepted as read.

The Treasurer's report was given by Ruth Norcross, Treasurer. She showed a balance of \$3,515.04 in the checking account, \$6,464.03 in the scholarship account and a total of \$16,133.84 in the life member CD and money market accounts for a total funds to date of \$26,112.91. President Everett Sanborn read the auditor's report from Alice M Kenney of Candia NH stating that she has examined the books and they are all in order. A question was asked about how much is budgeted for English research? We do not set aside any specific amount. It has been funded as needed. Last year we spent \$830.00.

New Business – Jim Davidson made a motion that starting in 2004 we award a \$200.00 scholarship to a college student and eliminate the high school scholarship. The motion was seconded by Ruth MacPherson. Motion carried.

SANBORNS IN THE NEWS

Both John K Sanborn & Marsha Wilgis have sent me information about Sanborn-Skyline County Park in Santa Clara County CA. It is named after **Kendall Sanborn** (#644 viii in V C Sanborn) who apparently gave or sold the land to the County. To quote the website: "This lushly wooded park of over 3,600 acres, is nestled in the Santa Cruz Mountains". It features hiking, camping, and picnicking areas. You can find the website by going to URL www.parkhere.org (For Santa Clara County parks) Then click on "Find a Park", then click on "Sanborn - Skyline". What the website doesn't mention is that the park is almost directly on the San Andreas fault.

It details **Herman R Sanborn's** interest in ham radio and the role he played in lending assistance after the Worcester tornado of 1953. A SANBORN STORY

[Editor's note: the following, somewhat edited, was sent to me via email by a Sanborn researcher.]

I have an interesting story to tell. I am a descendant of Lt John Samborne through Enoch, Ebenezer, Mark, & Ebenezer Cleveland [VCSanborn #400], who was born in Bath NH and moved his family to NY state in the Niagara Falls area. One of his 9 children was my great grandfather, Israel Gilman Smith Sanborn [1824-89].

I lived my whole life in Illinois until we moved to Arkansas in 1991. Three years after my husband passed away, I remarried and moved to another house in the same community. I became friendly with a neighbor living across the street. We, of course, never mentioned our maiden names but when her husband passed away, I found her maiden name was also Sanborn!

After checking with her family in Iowa, we found that my neighbor's great grandfather was Josiah Fisher Wilson Sanborn, son of Ebenezer Cleveland Sanborn and the brother of my great grandfather, Israel G S Sanborn. After the Civil War, Josiah had settled in Iowa while my great grandfather stayed in NY. My grandfather, Daniel Lee Sanborn [VCSanborn has "David Lee"] left to become a minister in Indiana, finally settling in Illinois.

So you never know if you might have a distant relative living across the street! Just wish I had found out if the other two Sanborns I met through the years were related. *Shirley Sanborn Haufe, Bella Vista AR.*

[Editor: V C Sanborn must have had some incorrect information about Josiah Fisher Wilson Sanborn as he writes (page 231) that Josiah "never married; a teacher in Grant county, Mich., now (1897) in Center Point, Ia." Josiah is quite certainly the "Josiah W Sandborn" in Grant, Linn County IA in the 1880 US census (page 232B) with wife "Adalaid", 45, born OH; son Francis, 19, b IA; son Ernest, 13, b IA; daughter Jessic, 4, b IA.]

SANBORN, NEW YORK

[Editor's note: the obituary of Jere Lee Sanborn in the Spring 2003 issue (p 12) elicited an email from SFA member John K Sanborn. It seems that the full obit in the "Niagara Gazette" of March 13 & 14 stated that Sanborn NY was named after Jere's ancestor, Lee R Sanborn (#994 in VC Sanborn). John corrects this in the following email that he sent to the editor of the "Gazette".]

"I read with interest the obituary for Jere Lee Sanborn in the *Niagara Gazette* on 3/13 and 3/14/2003. It states that he was a descendant '... of Lee R. Sanborn for whom the Hamlet of Sanborn, New York was named.' I would correct this to say that Lee R. Sanborn was the person responsible for naming the Town of Sanborn after his father, the Rev. E. C. Sanborn.



In the book 'Genealogy of the Family of Samborne or Sanborn in England and America, 1194-1898', by V.C. Sanborn of La Grange, Illinois, it is stated on page 393: 'Hon. Lee Randall Sanborn ... lives in the town of Sanborn, NY, which was named for his father', i.e., Rev. Ebenezer Cleveland Sanborn. Lee was a prominent businessman and land owner in what was then South Pekin. When he also became Post Master he managed to change the town's name to Sanborn.

This is the same E.C. Sanborn who is named on a window of St Paul's United Methodist Episcopal Church, on 7th Street, behind the Niagara Falls City Hall. See p. 32 of 'History of St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church, Niagara Falls, N.Y.' by Albert W Pierson (1924). See also *Niagara Falls Gazette* article dated 5/17/1954, page B 30.

I am a descendant of another of E.C. Sanborn's sons, Israel Gilman Smith Sanborn, born 1824 from his first wife, Almira Smith. Lee Randall Sanborn was born in 1831 from the second wife, Elizabeth Randall. Israel G. Sanborn married Anna Roberts in 1844 and had nine children, the last of which, Clark E. Sanborn, born 1864, was my Great Grandfather. He was an 'Expressman' in Buffalo and married Edith Delano (an ancestor of the Franklin Delano Roosevelt family) in 1888 and had two children, the second in 1890 was my Grandfather, Kenneth L. Sanborn who lived in Youngstown and Tonawanda.

Kenneth married his cousin, Frances Beecher, my Grandmother, who was the daughter of Lyman Beecher and Henrietta A. Sanborn. Henrietta was Clark's sister. By the way, Lyman Beecher is related to Harriet Beecher Stowe who wrote 'Uncle Tom's Cabin'. Harriet's father was also named Lyman Beecher and was a well known Presbyterian clergyman (see encyclopedia under "Beecher, Lyman").

Don't you just love genealogy!"

A SANBORN QUERY

[Editor's note: Richard Sanborn of CA wants to know more about his great grandfather, Pierce L Sanborn, born in Canada about 1845 - and not in V C Sanborn's *Sanborn Genealogy*. Who were his parents? He sent me quite a few details on this family and I'll try to summarize them here. A small problem is that he was known by several different name variations: Pierce L, Peter, Leroy, P L]

Pierce L Sanborn was born in Canada about 1845. He lived in MI from about 1865 until the late 1800's. He married Rebecca Jane Merrill (probably born Canada) in 1865 in Sanilac County MI and had several children born MI: Edward Thomas, George Albert, Charles Augustus, Harvey James, Stella M, Ambrose James, Melinda/Minnie. In 1870 they are

in Sanilac Co; in 1880 & 1884 in north Muskegon Co. By 1900 Pierce & his family had moved to the Seattle WA area with the exception of Richard's grandfather, Ambrose J, who remained in the Middle West.

In Seattle in 1900, Pierce worked as a shingle weaver as did 2 of his sons, the others also worked in the lumber industry. Pierce died in 1910.

By 1900 Minnie had married Will Williams and they had a daughter, Gladys, born in Dec 1898. They had at least 2 other daughters by 1920, Grace E (b 1904) and the third (name unreadable in the 1920 census) about 1915. Will worked in the lumber industry at first then became a shoemaker. Gladys had married a man surnamed Hunter by 1920.

In 1920 George A Sanborn (b about 1868) and wife, Clara B (b about 1880), had a daughter, Vivian (age 20) and her husband, Herman Studeman (21), living with them. George was a shingle cutter & Herman a riveter. In 1930, Herman was a painter of automobiles & Vivian was a telephone operator; there were no children with them.

In 1920 Charles A (b about 1879) was single & worked as a laborer in a saw mill. He was still single in 1930, living with his sister Minnie & her husband, Will Williams.

Stella (b about 1885) was single in 1910, living in her own apartment in Seattle.

Edward Thomas Sanborn moved to California where a death record seems to be his: born in MI 11 Apr 1869, died in Orange Co CA 25 Jun 1951.

I would like to find out who Pierce Sanborn's parents were and to make contact with his descendants.
