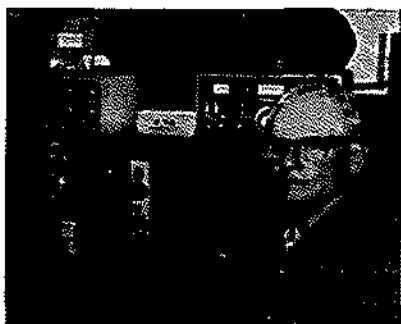

[Editor's note: Al Sanborn sent me an article from the Worcester MA paper. I contacted the author, Dana G Reed, and received his permission to reprint it here. This is from the 29 June 2003 issue of the Worcester Sunday Telegram, page C4. The 'Editor's note' below is by the editor of the newspaper.]

Ham Radio guru was entwined with Worcester history.
Sanborn rode the airwaves through WWII,
the Tornado of '53.

Editor's note: Dana G. Reed of Spencer met Herman R. Sanborn in 1981, when Mr. Reed was 19 years old, and was inspired to begin a lifelong avocation in amateur radio. After Mr. Sanborn's death in 1997, Mr. Reed purchased the homemade radio equipment that had long operated in the cellar of the Sanborn home. In this article, Mr. Reed tells about Mr. Sanborn's legacy in Worcester, and particularly about his service to the city and its residents after the tornado of 1953.



Herman R Sanborn

Worcester — His nickname, Herman the German, was familiar to his friends and on-air acquaintances within the world-wide ham radio community. It was often the first clue to strangers that the venerable longtime Worcester resident was both clever and colorful.

Herman R. Sanborn was born in 1908 in Canada. At an early age, he and his family immigrated to the United States, first residing in Shrewsbury and later moving to Worcester.

Too young to enlist during World War I, Herman joined the National Guard and served from 1930 to 1934. When the United States entered World war II in 1941, he was drafted at the advanced age of 33 and assigned to an Army Air Corps installation in North Dakota. During this time, he was involved in classified radar development technology for the U.S. military, and also taught some 25,000 U.S. combat pilots to service their radios in the field under disadvantageous, and often dangerous, wartime conditions.

This post was a natural one for Herman, who held the rank of technical sergeant. He'd been learning and experimenting

with the radio phenomenon since an early age. In 1926, when radio was still in its infancy, Herman was formally licensed at age 17 at amateur - or "ham" - radio by the Federal Communications Commission. He was given call sign 1LC, which was changed to W1LC in 1928. At the time, Herman and his brother Orin, who also later became a ham operator, lived on Beacon Street in Shrewsbury.

Herman married the former Barbara Wiggin in 1943 and they raised three children - Dana, Dean and Nancy - on Moreland Street in Worcester. This was a high-terrain area in close proximity to the original WAAB (now WFTQ) AM-1440 commercial transmitting towers in Tatnuck, on the west side of the city.

Herman and Orin began a side business repairing radios and early vintage television sets that became common in U.S. households. Many of the early wood-cabinet TV receivers of the late 1940s and early 50s had oscillator circuits that drifted considerably and required constant realignment. This was a profitable, but frustrating, experience for the brothers, and more so for owners of the relatively new invention.

It was during these post-war years that Herman's radio station began to take an increasingly organized and potent form. High-power transmission began after he constructed a rather large radio-frequency power amplifier out of a collection of parts that included a surplus military cabinet and many new and surplus electrical components that were abundantly available on the post-war market.

Ironically, the completion of Herman's home-made amplifier coincided almost exactly with the regional airport being moved from Grafton to its present location on a high-terrain area in West Tatnuck. As the crow flies, this new airport location was just about a mile from Herman's ham radio operating position on Moreland Street. A legal collision course was forming that would bring Herman into conflict with airport and city officials for more than a decade.

The great Tornado

However, before that battle ensued, Herman was to play an important role in the lives of many city residents on a fateful June day in 1953. On that day, June 9, Worcester and several communities to the northwest and the east were struck by a tornado of mammoth proportions. Nearly 100 people were killed, nearly a thousand were injured and thousands more were left homeless. For a time, Herman's radio took on a more significant role than ever before.

Dana Sanborn, Herman's son, described the scene at their Moreland Street home shortly after the deadly tornado passed through the Worcester area. The large, outdoor high-frequency antennas that his father used to receive and transmit signals had miraculously sustained little damage.

Four temporary sleeping cots were immediately set up in the garage, Dana recalled, and the house became a whirl of activity - not just for a day but for weeks to follow. The Red Cross was stationed outside and used the operating position as a radio dispatch center in the relief effort.

Herman developed specific operating schedules with other ham operators in other parts of the city, state and country. Information was shared and emergency and relief needs were exchanged. Locally, people known as "runners" would deliver messages to Herman at his operating position in the cellar or to the Red Cross officials on site and these would be relayed as necessary by Herman's radio to other local or regional stations.

Many displaced and anxious people eventually showed up at the Moreland Street residence. Dana said he remembers people waiting in line to request communications with relatives throughout the country. Herman would contact another ham operator in the desired part of the country, who would, in turn, use a phone patch to enable a long-distance emergency link from Worcester to the desired party. The use of such phone patches greatly enhanced the message-passing ability to the general public.

Dana said he recalls people being at their home for days, many crying in their cars, overwhelmed by the shock, loss of lives and property damage. The enormity of what had happened in their home city and the surrounding towns was settling in.

As normal lines of communication were slowly restored throughout the area, the emergency activity at 91 Moreland St. began to commensurately dwindle. Herman and his family received many expressions of thanks and gratitude for his time as the primary station operator, and for the hospitality of the family in the wake of the deadly and destructive tornado. As July approached, life in Worcester appeared to be returning to normal.

Trouble in Hamelot

The relocation of the regional airport from Grafton to Worcester did not, by itself, invoke a radio frequency interference issue. The eventual installation of radar apparatus at the airport in the late 1950s, however, did. Dana recalls that from 1958 to 1969, his father was involved in three distinct court cases concerning the issue of radio frequency interference to the Worcester Airport's radar equipment.

He remembers one occasion when several uniformed Worcester police officers visited their Moreland Street home to view his father's radio room. Herman flipped the switches for them and demonstrated how radio operation - especially transmission - would typically occur, and also showed them his techniques for shielding radio frequencies.



The crux of Herman's legal defense was that his experimentation and licensing at amateur radio from such an early date would effectively "grandfather" his operation. If successful, this strategy would essentially nullify the city's legal effort concerning complaints about interference. Basically, the airport would have to make any remedies to suppress RFI on its own equipment and at its expense.

As the end of America's turbulent 1960s decade approached, Herman triumphed in all three cases and the city was required to pick up his legal expenses, which by this time were considerable.

Final Transmissions

Herman retired in 1973 from Woodbury and Company printers in Worcester. His retirement gift was none other than the then-top-of-the-line Yaesu FT-101 ham transceiver (a receiver and transmitter combination in one package). This piece of equipment would provide "the original W1LC" with more than two decades of communications service and enjoyment from his hilltop home. But a person's later years are often unkind, and can even be cruel. This was the case for Herman as the end of the 20th century approached. He lost his oldest son, Dean, at age 45 in 1990. He lost his wife the following year.

Although doggedly independent and determined to live alone, Herman's health began to fail as he struggled with the onset of Alzheimer's disease. In June of 1997, without any identification on his person, Herman wandered away from his home of 46 years and traveled on foot to downtown Worcester.

He was picked up on the street and, unable to recite either his name or home address, he was procedurally institutionalized. He died of cardiopulmonary arrest in the same facility on Dec. 9, 1997, and became a "Silent Key," as the amateur radio community denotes a ham operator who has died.

With his passing, Herman left a considerable legacy.

Besides his big, legendary radio equipment - designed and built from ordinary parts using ingenuity and skills that have sadly become rare - he left memories for many of his generosity and decency, of his willingness to take even a nosy, question-a-second teenager under his wing and inspire him in countless and subtle ways in the radio art.

And surely, there are still people, here and across the country, who especially remember the kindnesses and sacrifices that Herman Sanborn extended to so many during those dark, stormy days 50 years ago.

In the 1900 census, Foster & 'Minnie' are newly weds in Worcester MA (ED 1729, sheet 5A), he born in Canada, she born MA. In the 1920 census of Webster MA (ED 176, sheet 12A) Foster is a widower with children, Carl (17, born Canada), Orin (13, born MA), Herman (11, born MA), Ina (7, born CT) & niece Mildred Sanborn (17, b Canada). MARK SANBORN

[Editor's note: Al Sanborn found Mark Sanborn and made the original contact with him. I asked Mr Sanborn to summarize his speaking career for our newsletter. What follows is his work.]

[Editor's footnote. Mark reports his Sanborn ancestry as: father Leslie Sanborn, grandfather Harold Sanborn (wife Vera), great grandfather Harry Sanborn. Harold & Vera originally farmed in Chardon, Geauga County OH, but by the time he was born, Harold & Leslie were farming in Colebrook, Ashtabula County OH.]

From the Editor: I haven't been able to connect Mark's Sanborn ancestors to any in the VC Sanborn book. From a rather quick look online using primarily the censuses, I can find Harry's family in Chardon in 1920 as Harry L (age 41, born OH), wife Helen W (41, born OH), children Kenneth M (17, born OH), Harold L (15, born OH), & Perry[?] H (7, born OH). Harry & Helen are in the same county in 1910 & 1900. I tried to find Harry in the 1880 census & came up with only one Harry born about 1879: age 1, son of Liva & Hattie Sanborn (ages 30 & 23), with Harry's brother, Verna, born May 1880. This is in Kirtland, Lake County OH, perhaps 10 miles from Chardon. In the next house on the census form are Liva's probable parents, Edson (64) & Laura (65) Sanborn.

The online Mormon records do have a Harry Liva Sanborn (born 6 Nov 1878) & Robert H Sanborn (born 21 May 1880) sons of Liva B Sanborn & Hattie Hazen. The Hattie Hazen seems to be the daughter of Winchester Hazen (born VT) & Laura Perry (born NY) whose family can be found in Munson, Geauga County, in the 1860 & 1870 censuses. I can supply more details to anyone who requests them. The Mormon information, of course, does need to be checked with the original records.

RUTH (HECKMAN) SANBORN

[Editor's note: the following is an article that enlarges on the briefer obituary, found below. It was written by Amy Martinez Starke of The Oregonian (Portland OR) staff and published on 12 Feb 2004 on p B4]

Ruth Sanborn's first gig was dancing the Charleston for the Kiwanis Club when she was 4. For most of the next 80 years, she shimmied, strutted and jiggled on stages in New York, Los Angeles and Portland.

In about 1980, Ruth formed the Ruth Sanborn Dancers, average age 65, with a great-grandma or two among them. She took stagestruck women who didn't know dance steps had names and taught them how to perform as either Baby Jane or Santa Claus, how to hold a cane and hat, how to enter and exit a stage.

She split them up into the Tanglefoots (featuring Sophie Tucker and Carol Channing impersonations), the Hotfoots (tap and clog to contemporary country music) and the Stir Crazies (clown or flapper routine).

With pianist and drummer, the groups performed at conventions, clubs and retirement centers throughout Oregon and for special events such as the Rose Festival. They were on "AM Northwest." They won competitions at the Multnomah County and Oregon State fairs.

"If we can do it," Ruth often said to audiences, "you can do it." She did much to brighten the days of people at nursing homes, where some tapped their feet from their wheelchairs and beds.

Audiences loved the frequent changes of elaborate costumes and the upbeat, familiar tunes. "I Can Do Without Broadway" might start the show, followed by "A Good Man Is Hard to Find," "42nd Street," "Up the Lazy River" and "Bye Bye Blues."

Ruth did not have a good singing voice. She sounded just like Channing and, draped in wig, feather boa and rhinestones, looked like her, too. During the years, she got many a standing ovation with "Hello, Dolly!" and "Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend."

Ruth, who had been a drill sergeant in the Women's Army Corps, was always in charge. She found the members, taught the classes, got the music and choreography, and booked the shows. She was controlling and could be a pain. "You're out of line!" "Left foot!" she'd yell at her dancers. Then she could turn on the charm. Most stuck with her because she was a good teacher.

Health problems finally halted her dancing, and she had to give up the group. Without dance, she went downhill. She died Feb. 7, 2004, at 85.

Ruth Heckman was one of nine children and was raised in Wenatchee, Wash. Her older sister was a flapper. Ruth moved to New York, where story has it she was a Rockette when she was 18.

In the Army, she met Kenneth Sanborn, and they married in



1944. After World War II, he went to law school, and Ruth was with the Eugene Loring Ballet in Los Angeles, took dance classes with Leslie Caron and Cyd Charisse, and operated a studio in Glendale, Calif. They had one child, later separated, and Ruth moved to Portland and helped raise her grandchildren.

From her Jantzen Beach mobil [sic] home and later homes in Aloha and King City, she watched anything about dance on TV, especially tap. She took Gregory Hines' choreography and adapted it for her seniors. She was teaching as recently as a year ago. Some of her dancers, now with a Ruth Sanborn-taught sense of timing and show, kept going. Ruth even got on the phone and tried to drum up another dance group once she heard the show was going on without her.

DOROTHY (SANBORN) WAUGH

[Editor's note: Dorothy Waugh's obit was in the Fall 2003 issue. Our Genealogist, George Sanborn, sent me an article about Dorothy that was recently published in the Kennebec Journal (Augusta ME). I am reprinting parts of that article here. I must also correct a sentence in her obit in the Fall 2003 issue: the 6th sentence should read "She was predeceased by her husband." The article was published 19 Feb 2004 & written by Dan McGillvray with copyright 2004 by Blethen Maine Newspapers Inc.]

Vienna [ME] – Dorothy Waugh's commitment to the town has extended beyond her 86 years of living here.

The slightly built woman, known locally as the "Egg Lady" because of her home-based business of selling eggs, left a \$1 million trust fund to benefit groups and churches here.

While the amount she amassed caught many in this town of 500 residents by surprise, Waugh's final wish to support her community financially is typical of how she lived. ...

Waugh was born in 1917 in the house in the village owned by her mother and father, Laura and Wallace Sanborn, along the edge of Mill Pond. She lived there until shortly before she died in a Farmington nursing home last May. ...

[Among] the organizations and groups that are due to receive money ... are Mill Stream Grange, the Vienna Historical Society, Vienna Baptist Church, Vienna Methodist Church, the town, and one of Vienna's cemeteries.

The money is expected to be distributed from interest payments on the principal. ...

Waugh was one of the town's best known – and most visible – residents. She attended both churches and was a member of the Grange and the historical society. Waugh also was Vienna's elected treasurer for about 30 years and was known for once refusing a pay raise.

"At her funeral, we had a solid hour of people telling stories about Dorothy," [Libby] Harville said Wednesday of last year's service at Vienna Baptist Church. Some of those attending told of buying eggs at her home.

Waugh sold eggs into the 1980s. When customers came by, she would ask about their families and neighbors. The information she gleaned often appeared in her social columns published in the Kennebec Journal, the Franklin Journal and the Lewiston Sun-Journal.

When she was younger, Waugh and her husband, Clyde, delivered eggs from their village poultry farm to customers in and around Vienna, with the route extending north to Farmington.

Waugh met her husband while he was boarding in her parents' home, Harville said. They married in 1944. Clyde Waugh died in 1997. The couple had no children. ...

A Farmington High School graduate, Waugh lived her entire life in Vienna. She only started slowing down over the past two years. She attended Grange meetings in other towns and drove to the events into her 80s.

Harville said Waugh represented the best qualities of small-town life.

"She was there for everybody in town, and she was involved with everything in town. She was a real independent lady," she said. Harville said Waugh and her contemporaries made Vienna "a special place" to live.

HARVEY B SANBORN MD

[Editor's note: the following came to me from Al Sanborn (in 2002!) from a friend of a friend. The original sender had found it online. I checked the original at the RI Historical Society & corrected a couple of online typos and added the V C Sanborn references. I also discovered that Dr Sanborn's daughter-in-law lives a couple of blocks from me in Bristol RI so I will probably add more details to this printed story in the Fall Sanborn Signatures. The biography comes from page 315, History of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations - Biographical by Thomas Williams Bicknell, published 1920 in New York by The American Historical Society, Inc.]

Harvey Beede Sanborn, M.D. – Among the successful physicians of Providence, R.I., is Dr. Harvey Beede Sanborn [V C Sanborn #1496 iv (iii)], who has won for himself a position high in the esteem and affection of the community. Dr. Sanborn is a native of Rochester, N.H., a son of William Henry [VCS #1496 iv] and Sarah (Beede) Sanborn, the former of whom is now deceased and the latter makes her home in Connecticut. The elder Mr. Sanborn was engaged in the occupation of farming at Rochester, N.H. Dr. Sanborn is a



descendant from distinguished and ancient New England families on both sides of the house, and his maternal name is one of the most ancient in England, dating back to Anglo-Saxon times.

The education of Dr. Sanborn was secured in the public schools of Rochester, which he attended for a number of years, and was graduated from the Rochester High School with the class of 1897. He then entered the Moses Brown School of Providence, where he studied for one year, and completed the preparatory portion of his education. Dr. Sanborn then entered Dartmouth College where he took the usual classical course, and was graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1902. In 1902 he entered the medical school in connection with Harvard University, from which he was graduated with the class of 1906, receiving his degree of M.D. Dr. Sanborn supplemented his theoretical studies with practical experience gained as an interne in the Rhode Island Hospital at Providence, where he remained some eighteen months. In that time he had clearly demonstrated his ability and learning, and was accordingly appointed assistant superintendent of the same hospital, remaining there for two years. At the expiration of that time he spent three months associated with the Lying-In Hospital in Providence, and then, in the year 1910, began the general practice of his profession here. While carrying on a general practice, Dr. Sanborn has made a special study of neurology and is an authority in this department of pathology. At the present time, in addition to his private work, he holds the post of assistant neurologist in the Rhode Island Hospital and assistant consulting neurologist at the Lying-In Hospital here. Dr. Sanborn is a member of the Providence Medical Society, the Rhode Island Medical Society, the Rhode Island Medical Legal Society, and a fellow of the American Medical Association. He is also a member of the Phi Gamma Delta, a college fraternity, which he joined as a young college student. In politics Dr. Sanborn is an independent Republican, and in his religious belief a Congregationalist, attending the church of that denomination at Providence.

Dr. Harvey Beede Sanborn was united in marriage, June 10, 1910, at Brockton, Mass., with Bernice Monk, a daughter of Jacob Francis and Cora E. Monk, old and highly respected residents of Brockton, Mass. To Dr. and Mrs. Sanborn three children have been born, as follows: Norman Paul, William Edgar, and Philip Harvey.

LULA M SANBORN & HER DESCENDANTS

Last November the Editor saw a query on the online Sanborn List about Lula M Sanborn. She turned out to be in the 1880 census in Fremont, Rockingham Co, NH, Enumeration District 208, page 2, listed with her father, Isaiah Sanborn (V

C Sanborn # 1254), her mother, Mary H, also born a Sanborn (V C Sanborn #549 vii), and Lula's half-brother, Madison Sanborn (V C Sanborn #1254 i); Madison also had a sister, Loretta E (V C Sanborn #1254 ii). Lula is not in V C Sanborn's book, so what follows is additional to V C Sanborn.

The person who sent in the query was a Jack W Ralph of Carson City NV. He was seeking confirmation of Lula's parents. Jack is not a Sanborn descendant but was helping a cousin who is descended from Lula. Jack did send on information about Lula's descendants which I will summarize below, not including names of living persons.

Lula M Sanborn was born in 1865 and died in 1945; she is buried in Fremont NH. She married Charles Ellsworth Beede, who was born 10 May 1861 in Fremont & died 2 June 1934; he is also buried in Fremont. Mary & George Osgood had 3 children, Wilferd B Osgood (4 Aug 1911 - 18 Mar 1988 in Farmington NH), and 2 daughters, still living. 5) Ella A Beede (27 Aug 1893 - 19 Sep 1918) who married J E Beede. 6) Eva A Beede (Apr 1895 - 12 Feb 1943) who married Edgar A Dame. 7) Fred C Beede (25 Feb 1903 - 1963). 8) Frank Ellsworth Beede (9 Nov 1907 - 22 Jun 2000) who married and had at least 1 son.

I'd like to remind readers to note the Scholarship announcement below. I'm not certain exactly when SFA members will receive this issue, but get your applications in to Priscilla as quickly as possible, if you haven't done so already. Also reserve **August 6 & 7, 2005**, for the next SFA biennial meeting. The dates are tentative and the probable location will be the Rutland VT area.

Please keep sending me Sanborn related material. I appreciate any and all such items; most will get into *Sanborn Signatures* or at least a mention. I do find it difficult to believe that only one of us had any children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces, or nephews born or wed in the past 6 months. Family pride dictates that we should let the rest of us know about the extended Sanborn family. I have access to many (but not all) obituaries but not to births & weddings. I need help for them; and why not college & high school graduations, too.

Our SFA Genealogist, George F Sanborn Jr, has undoubtedly figured out one of the given names on a calling card name printed in the Fall issue on page 4, 7th one down: "Stulira? Dearborn" is almost certainly "Statira Dearborn". Going online I found that the name Statira was pretty rare: in the 1860 US census there were only 53 people with that name with most located in the NE states (ME 13, NH 8, CT 8, MA 7). I 'googled' the name online to discover its origin. Turns

out it was the name of Alexander the Great's Persian wife. I wonder if the New England educational system with an emphasis on the classical world helped to 'popularize' the name? Does anyone know of a Statira Sanborn in their ancestry? V C Sanborn doesn't have any in his 'Sanborn' index.

In order to save space most of the obituaries below are shortened versions of the original. I've included all the basic genealogical details including names of immediate relatives. If anyone, however, would like to have a copy of the full obit, please write me & I'll mail them a copy. The same goes for the 'Sanborn news' items that are summarized; I'd be glad to send a copy of the original article.

Sanborn and Elvira C. _____. Bride's parents: Jas. Anthony and Ruth _____. Witnesses: Chas. J. Baker and Freeman Anthony.

The editor's son found the editor's name in a special section of the *Boston [MA] Globe* recently. It was in a list of people who had abandoned property in the hands of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Unfortunately, I didn't



recover my millions - it was someone else with the same name. So I like to think it was only 10 cents rather than \$10,000,000. But who knows? And I looked for Sanborns and found two names: **Derek Sanborn & Kimberly Sanborn**. Anyone know these Sanborns? They may or may not be related to each other; it may have been 4 years ago or 45 years ago. But Massachusetts is holding property for them. They can call the office of the State Treasurer and Receiver General at 1-800-647-2300, Mon-Fri 8-8, Sat 9-4.

Fictional Sanborns: the editor is very grateful to former SFA president, Al Sanborn, for all his emails, clippings, etc, that he sends to me. Recently he noted two fictional characters who were Sanborns plus the real David Sanborn, jazz saxophonist. I need to do some more research on the latter & that should make a nice short article in a future *Sanborn Signatures*. I will quote from Al's email about the fictional folk:

"One of the more popular recent movies is 'Something's Gotta Give,' starring Jack Nicholson as **Harry Sanborn**. I'm not going to attempt to describe the character of good old Harry, but he certainly was an interesting one! I don't remember seeing a movie previously where a principal was named Sanborn.

I just finished a murder mystery in which one of the principals was named **Diana Sanborn**, 70-year-old daughter of Edward P. Sanborn, legendary founder of El Nido, an isolated valley along the California coast. Diana plays a significant role throughout the entire book. And I thoroughly enjoyed reading the book, especially for the legal proceedings that are the meat of the plot. The book is *Actual Innocence*, by Barry Siegel, Random House, 1999. (He is also the author of *The Perfect Witness*)"

Another Worcester MA newspaper article sent in by Al Sanborn dealt with a company called Yankee Microwave of Harrison ME which deals with the field of video surveillance.
