On 22 July 22 1922, the *Daily Facts* newspaper of Redlands CA carried an enthusiastic announcement regarding the opening of a new business in the former Redlands Heights Orchard Company packing house location at Sixth Street and the Santa Fe Railroad tracks.

The spokesman was Harry Lee Jones, treasurer of the Sanborn Foods Company of Los Angeles. His report stated that one of their two processing plants in Los Angeles was about to lose its lease and that plant would be relocated to Redlands, opening for business by September 1st. Since the company already had experienced success in Southern California, the plant was expected to operate on a big scale, starting with baked apples. Thirty men and six women would be employed to work eleven months of the year, with the expectation that more would be hired later.

prietor of the Globe Preserving Works. In 1869 he [George, Sr.] bought the first carload of canned fruit brought from California to Boston, it being some of the first product of the Cutting Packing Company, one of the pioneer houses of San Francisco," stated the article in the Daily Facts.

The son, George O. Sanborn, originated and invented more than 150 canned food processes. In addition to baked apples the company was known for a variety of treats including the following: baked pears, stuffed peppers, baked stuffed tomatoes, baked quinces, baked persimmons, fruit salad, peppersauce, pickled green English walnuts, sweet orange marmalade, bitter orange marmalade, grapefruit marmalade, tomatoes, apricots, peaches, etc.

The baked apples were available the following four ways: Plain (without sugar), Deviled (with lemon & sugar), Angelled (with bananas, lemon, & sugar), and Witch (with raisins, lemon, & sugar).

At the time of the announcement of this new, fruit canning enterprise, Redlands and its neighboring communities (Loma Linda, Highland, Mentone, Riverside, Yucaipa, et al.) were noted for their citrus groves and various orchards including peach, pear, nectarine, apricot, plum, grape, and in the foothills, apples. Indeed, the San Bernardino-Riverside valley ranches were akin to a huge fruit bowl!

Redlands, for many years, rated the title of "Navel Orange Capital of the World." The fruit industry provided thousands of jobs. To the local directors of the Chamber of Commerce, the new Sanborn Food Processing Company seemed like a great idea, and they were delighted the company chose Redlands.


The 1923 edition of the Redlands City Directory carried a bright-orange print advertisement for Sanborn Foods at the front of the book, as well as the Sanborn name stamped on the binding. The next edition, in 1925, was the last to list the company. A brief entry stated, "Sanborn Foods, Inc. --- W. C. Guerth, Trustee, 6th & Santa Fe tracks." There was no advertisement.

On 5 April 1924, the Los Angeles Times announced that Mr E J Post had succeeded in reorganizing the Sanborn Foods Company after purchasing the Sanborn plant through the United States bankruptcy court. According to the article, the plant would concentrate on the making of jams, jellies, and marmalades, after undergoing a thorough overhauling.

A year and a half later the *Times* (14 Nov 1926) carried a brief announcement from Redlands which stated that "the Western Fruit Company, packers and shippers of California fruits," had purchased the former Sanborn Foods Company packing house. The new owners would be putting in the latest machinery for packing oranges and the plant would have the capacity of filling four railroad cars of fruit daily.

The new enterprise must have started on a better note because Western Fruit Growers, as they were known locally, stayed in business through the 1970s and possibly later. They shared their warehouse space with the Peppers Fruit Company for many years and, in 1933, the two enterprises were combined under the Western Fruit name. Mr J G Chapman Jr and W R Carl were successful managers in the early days, and E R Larsen was the well-known ownermanager for several decades.

What happened to Sanborn Foods and the high hopes for success? The local newspapers apparently did not record the departure or demise of the company, so we are left to wonder what went wrong. Of the men on the company's board of directors, only Harry Lee Jones, treasurer, resided in Redlands, not in a house but at the Casa Loma Hotel. Could the company's lack of involvement in Redlands have led to a breakdown in communications? Was it simply a case of poor management? Was the country no longer in the mood for such unique and exotic canned fruits? Or could the age of

the owner have been a factor since he was nearly seventy years old at the time the company came to town?

It appears that the canned fruit business did not live up to its predicted potential. Author Lawrence E. Nelson, PhD, in his 1963 book, *Only One Redlands*, mentions two companies which failed in the period after World War 1--the Jones Cider and Vinegar Company and Sanborn Foods. Both, he concluded, left a "slightly sour taste in the mouths of Redlands investors."

Author's note: V C Sanborn likely erred in stating George Otis Sanborn's (526-I) birth year as 1835. This writer believes the date should have been 1855, since his parents did not wed until 1854, when his father was 35 years old.

SANBORNS – CANNERS & KNIT GOODS Charles A Watson

Editor & author's note: when Ardith James sent me the above article about the Sanborn Foods Company, I thought it might be interesting to learn more about that Sanborn family. As a result of a fairly quich research project using some vital records, census records, city directories labbreviated CD in this article], V C Sanborn book, and our own Sanborn Signatures, I've come up with the following information. Although there is a 'George' in each generation, the respective parents kindly used a different middle name with a different initial letter to make reading this easier. As a result of the research, I ended up finding a SFA member, Marilyn Sanborn Gwartney, great granddaughter of George O Sanborn. She has helped me fill in more precisely dates and places by sending me a letter, some photographs, and a printout of her ancestry. I've indicated my reliance on her family information with an asterisk [*].

George Perkins Sanborn

As described in Ardith's article above, George P was involved in the canning business in Boston in the mid to late 19th century. According to V C Sanborn (# 526, page 275) he was born 26 May 1819 to Jeremiah Gilman Sanborn (# 201) & Abigail Perkins. Although VC Sanborn doesn't give a specific place of birth, the later census records state George P was born in NH and Marilyn Gwartney's family information states it was Sanbornton.* This is where his mother came from and where V C Sanborn stated his father lived. Again according to V C Sanborn, George P married Frances H Rublec on 20 Oct 1854; lived in Chelmsford MA; later in Boston," where he

founded the firm of G. P. Sanborn & Co., No. 4 Chatham Row, dealers in canned goods and pickles" [VCS, p 275]. His mother, Frances Harriet, was born in Berkshire, Franklin County, VT in March 1829*. Marilyn's data gives her parents as Norman & Abigail Rublee/Roblee.* 1 haven't been able to find Frances in the 1850 census in VT although there is a Norman & Abagail Rublee family in Woodbury, Washington County VT, with a daughter "Fanny J" aged 11 - which is 10 years too young, but this could be a census taker's error.

Their one and only child, George Otis Sanborn, was born in Middlesex, Washington County, VT, 13 Nov 1855 or 1856*. VCS has George O's birth year wrong, giving his birth date as 13 Nov "1835". Since his parents married in Oct 1854, the year probably was 1855 or 1856. The 1900 census gives his birth month as Nov, and (also in error) his birth year as "1876" with his age as 43. That age suggests he was born in Nov 1856.

By the 1870 census, George P, wife Frances, & son George O (age 14, born VT), were living in Boston. George P's occupation was 'canning fruit', George O's was 'clerk in store'. In the 1877 Boston CD, George P was living in Somerville MA and his business, George P Sanborn & Son, was at 6 Chatham Row, Boston, and they were "manufacturers' agents". By the 1880 census and 1880 Boston CD, they were living at 36 Appleton St, in Boston's South End, fairly close to downtown; the business, George P Sanborn & Son, was at 4 Chatham Row and involved "pickles & canned goods". By coincidence, there was a Sanborn cousin living at 24 Appleton St; Ebenezer Sanborn (VCS # 1830) was George P's third cousin, twice removed. Also note that there were 11 George Sanborn's in Boston itself in the 1880 census - a popular name - still is.

For the years 1885, 87, & 88, the Boston city directories indicate that the family lived in West Somerville, and the pickle business, George P Sanborn & Co, was variously located at 28 North Market in 1885 [now part of the Quincy Market redevelopment], at 66 Commercial St (1887), and back at 28 North Market (1888).

The Sanborn family moved west about 1892 to Sonoma County CA (north of San Francisco) and set up a business there.* By the 1900 census they had moved to Oakland CA. In that census, George P & Frances reside with their son's family, with George P's occupation as "pickles & preserves". This census confirms that they had only one child. George P is in the Oakland CDs 1902-6 with no occupation listed - he presumably was retired by then. Marilyn writes that they had a business in Ghiradelle Square in San Francisco, a woolen business, that burned down in the great 1906 earthquake.* It's likely that the family decided to begin anew elsewhere as George P & Frances follow their son to Seattle WA by 1907



and are listed with him in the 1910 Seattle census. George P is in the Seattle CDs for 1907, 08, & 10, living with his son. The 1912 Seattle CD lists Frances H as the widow of George P and residing with her son.

Both George P & Frances died in Seattle, the former 5 Jul 1910 and the latter 13 Mar 1913.*

George Otis Sanborn

For George O's birth and early years, see above. He was married in Cambridge MA 29 Jan 1881 to Annie M Winter, who was born in Frederickton New Brunswick, the daughter of Richard P & Rebecca S. George O was a resident of Boston, age 25, a merchant, and born in Middlesex VT of George P & Francis H [MA Marriages, vol 326, p 61, MA State Archives]. They had two children born in Somerville MA: George W, born 3 Nov 1882 [MA Births, vol 332, p 223]; and Frances, born 23 June 1883 [MA Births, vol 341, p 214]. Marilyn's family tree has Annie's parents as Richard P Winter, born in 1818 in Fredericton NB, and Rebeckah Susanna Ward, born 10 Aug 1822 in Horton NS. They were married in Fredericton on 16 Apr 1843.*

In the early Boston CDs George O is listed with his father in 1877 & 1880. In 1883 he is living in Somerville, as a married man, and the "Sanborn Pickle Co" is at 374 Atlantic Ave, Boston. In 1889 & 1890 he is living in West Somerville & the pickle business is at 4 Commercial St, Boston. Note that the business itself moved around a good deal.

As noted above, he, his family, and his parents moved to California about 1892. In the 1900 census they are renting a house at 2118 Elm St, Oakland, & his occupation is "pickling". His wife is "Maud A", born Sep 1860, married 19 years, and has 4 children, all still living; she was born in Canada and came to the US in 1871. They have their 4 children with them: George W, a "traveling agent", & Frances W; plus daughter Marion E, born in CA in July 1892, and son Henry, also born July 1892 in CA. George O also has his parents living with him.

The Oakland CDs for 1902-6 show George O living at 809 13th St (1902, 03) & 561 Sycamore St (1904, 05, & 06). The CDs also show that he changed occupations in the early years of the 20th century: in 1902 he's in "sauces", in 1903 he is a "commercial traveler", in 1905 he is a "knitter", in 1906 he's in "knitwear" in San Francisco.

In 1906 or 1907 he moves his family to Seattle WA, probably after the 1906 San Francisco earthquake. The 1907-11 Seattle CDs have George O as the "president & manager of Saxony Knit Goods Co" [SKGC] at 81 Marion St. Then in the 1912 CD, he is a "salesman"; and in 1913 & 14 he is the president of the Octonek Knitting Co at 425 Union St. In the 1910 census George O is the head of the family, age 54, mar-

ried 29 years, manager of a knit goods manufacturing company, & rents a home at 6506 1st Ave NE. With him are his wife, Annie M, his son Henry R, his parents, his other son, George W, the latter's wife, Clara M (31, married 7 years, with 2 children, both still living), and George W & Clara's children, George H (age 6) & Virginia C (age 4).

In Seattle, George O & his family lived at 6506 1st Ave NE (1907-10); at 1205 E 70th St (1911-13); at A1010 Stewart St (1914). George O is not in the 1915 or 1916 Seattle CDs or in the Los Angeles CDs for 1914-16, or 1918. He did move to Los Angeles, however, about 1916-17. In the Los Angeles 1917 CD he is simply listed as living at 118 N Mott St. He also lives at several other addresses in Los Angeles: 1117 Santee St (1920 CD), 1386 49th St (1920 census), 433 S Hope St (1921). In 1923 he has gone back to the canning business, being president of "Sanborn Foods Inc" and residing at 1225 Sanborn Ave (1923 CD). I wonder if Sanborn Ave was named after him or if it was simply a coincidence. The 1923 CD lists Sanborn Foods Inc as "canners", and having an office in room 508 at 524 S Spring St.

In the 1924 & 1925 Los Angeles CDs George O is still president of Sanborn Foods Inc, but resides in Redlands CA. See Ardith's article above. He isn't in the 1926 CD and the 1930 CD lists Anna M Sanborn, widow of G O, residing at 1225 Sanborn Ave with her daughter Frances S Wilson. His death is listed in the CA death index as occurring on 15 Feb 1929 in Los Angeles County at age 73 [state file # 9093] and Annie M Sanborn's death occurred on 10 Oct 1935 in Alameda County (Oakland area) at age 76 [state file # 55175?]. The Los Angeles Times for 16 Feb 1929, page 16, lists his death as: "Suddenly, February 15, George Otis Sanborn of 1225 Sanborn avenue. Funeral arrangements in charge of Brown Brothers, 935 West Washington street." Marilyn writes that George O had just had lunch in a Pasadena restaurant and he dropped dead of a heart attack outside on the sidewalk.*

George Winter Sanborn

For George W's birth & early census records, see above under his father's information. For a more personal article on George W's career, see Marilyn Sanborn Gwartney's article in Sanborn Signatures (vol XII, issue 2, Spring 1996, pp 2-3).

He first shows up in the CDs in the 1902 Oakland CD as residing with his father, George O. In the 1903 Oakland CD, he is listed as a "commercial traveler", living with his father at 809 13th St. In the 1904 CD he has his own household, being now married to Clara M, at 1370 Brush St. In the 1905 CD he is a "knitter" residing at 875 60th St. He married Clara May Sims 20 July 1902 in Seligman AZ.* Her parentage seems to be unknown: the various censuses that list parents' birthplaces (1910, 20, 30) gave hers as simply the USA or, in one instance, her mother as born in Germany. This indicates



that the family was unsure of Clara's parents' birth state. Clara's birthplace is given in the censuses as IL, MO, IN. Marilyn's family information has her born 9 July 1880 in Effingham IL.* I haven't been able to find anything more definitive.

George W obviously moved with the rest of his father's family as he showed up in the Seattle CD for 1907 living at 819 E 71st St and occupation "musical instruments". In 1908, 10, & 11 he is a "knitter" at his father's SKGC, living at different addresses in Seattle. In 1912 & 13 he is a "traveling salesman"; in 1914 a knitter again, perhaps at his father's Octonek Knitting Co. In 1920-26 CDs he is a salesman or traveling salesman in Los Angeles.

George W & Clara's children were both born in California, George Herbert Sanborn on 9 Nov 1903 in Oakland*, and Virginia Clare Sanborn in CA on 26 Feb 1905. Virginia apparently married a man named Zenk as the CA death index noted her death with that surname on 18 Aug 1995 in Marin County, age 90. Marilyn reported that much of her family information came from Virginia.

So in 1900 George W is living with his parents in Oakland; in 1910 he and his family are with his parents in Seattle. In 1920 George & Clara are living in Los Angeles with their two children and he is a "commercial traveler". By 1930, he & Clara are back in Oakland where he is a broker in the radio industry. Marilyn reported that he died in Novato CA on 8 Jan 1965; and Clara died there a few months later on 19 Oct 1965.*

To briefly note what I know about George Ws siblings: his (I) sister Frances, born in Somerville MA, married a man named Wilson about 1909. They had a daughter Katherine C Wilson, born 3 July 1910 in IL or IN; she married a man named Lang and she died 16 Dec 1999 in Contra Costa County CA. She was listed in the Oakland CDs as a student (1902-6); and in the 1930 Los Angeles CD she was a teacher in the city schools and living at 1225 Sanborn Ave. In the 1930 census for Los Angeles, she was a widow and the head of her family consisting of herself, her daughter and her mother. (2) Sister Marion E was born in July 1892 in CA. (3) Brother Henry was born 24 July 1892 in CA and died 13 June 1963 in Marin County CA. Most of the vital details came from the online CA death indices.

George Herbert Sanborn

As stated above, George H was born in Oakland, 9 Nov 1903.* He was living with his parents, grandparents, and great grandparents in Seattle in the 1910 census. With his parents in LA in the 1920 census. He married Norita Laurine Irwin on 12 June 1926 in Santa Ana CA.* She was born in Prescott AZ on 14 March 1909, the daughter of William Norman Irwin (1873-

1956) & Juanita Ella Smith (1882-1970).*

By 1930 George H & his family were recently settled in Seattle. In an unusual personal note, the 1930 census taker wrote they "moved in April 15th". He was a salesman for an oil firm and they had their two oldest children with them: George Robert (born 3 Feb 1928 in Los Angeles County CA) and Marilyn Arline (born 7 Aug 1929 in Los Angeles)*. Their second daughter, Donna Laurine, was born 3 Feb 1942 in Los Angeles Co CA.

The most recent generations

George Robert has three children; Marilyn Arline has 4 children, 13 grandchildren, and 2 great grandchildren, according to her descendancy chart; Donna Laurine has 2 children. This is based partly on the CA online birth indexes and partly on the information Marilyn sent me.

Postscript

After writing this article, I realized that the births of the two eldest children of George O & Annie (Winter) Sanborn were only 7 months & 3 weeks apart: George W on 3 Nov 1882 and Frances on 23 Jun 1883. Hmmm, I thought, did I make a transcription error? So, I went back to the MA State Archives & checked the original birth record books - and the dates are correct, Nov 1882 and June 1883. The 1900 census also has Nov 1882 & Jun 1883 for their birth month/year. The possibility exists that George W was born in 1881 and his parents didn't register George Ws birth for several weeks, until after the new year, and a clerical error was made in the Somerville City Clerk's office.

SANBORNS OF THE PAST

Ela & Delia (Hamilton) Sanborn

Editor's note: Lynn Sheren has sent in the following two obituaries of her great grandparents. Ela is #1345 in V C Sanborn, page 482, and the obits add to the little information that VCS has, including naming his wife and three children. The obit also suggests that VCS's reference to his living in "Minnesota" probably should read living in "Michigan". Note that the obit of their grandson, Charles E Sanborn, is in the list of recent obituaries below. The obits are from the Grand Ledge [MI] Independent, Ela's 4 July 1913, Delia's 23 May 1913.

Death of E. P. Sanborn

"E. P. Sanborn was born Jan. 29, 1836, at Waterbury, Vermont, and died at his home in Oneida, Saturday, June 28, of apoplexy.

The deceased spent his early life in Vermont, later going to

Medina, Ohio, where he was married to Miss Delia Hamilton Sept. 21, 1856. She preceded him in death May 22, 1913. After residing in Iowa for some time, he moved to Michigan and was in the music business in Lansing, where he lived 27 years. He has been a resident of Delta and Oncida townships the past 20 years. He leaves three children: Geo. Sanborn of this city, Mrs. Cora Sheren, at home, who has cared for her father and mother during their last sickness, and Mrs. Lettic Rolfe of Holt. He is also survived by 15 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Monday at one o'clock at the house, conducted by Rev. L. Severance, burial at Delta Center."

Death of Mrs. E. P. Sanborn

"Mrs. E. P. Sanborn passed away at her home in Oneida early yesterday morning, after an illness of five years. The deceased had been deprived of her eyesight the past three years.

Mrs. Sanborn was born in Medina county, Ohio, Sept. 1836, and has been a resident of Delta and Oneida the past twenty years.

Besides the husband she leaves two daughters, Mrs. Cora Sheron [sic], at home, and Mrs. Lettie Rolf of Holt, and one son, George of this city. One brother, Zenas Hamilton of Oneida, one sister, Mrs. Julia Horton of Ohio, one half-brother, Andrew Hamilton of Delta, and one half-sister, Mrs. Mason Soper of this city."

Lizzie & Booger

Editor's note: thanks to Ardith James for sending me a copy of an article with reference to a Lizzie Sanborn of Warner NH. It is in SooNipi Magazine, vol 22, # 3, Fall 2004; published in Sunapee NH. The article is "The Badger Farm in the Mink Hills" (pp 53-57) by John Warren. The article discusses a now protected parcel of land in Warner NH which seems to include the former farm of Lizzie Sanborn.

"She had the misfortune to fall in love with a hired hand named Sylvester Hoyt. Her father objected to them marrying perhaps because of an 8 year age difference but whatever the reason they spent the rest of their natural life together in these beautiful but inhospitable hills. 'Vest' who was also known as 'Booger' (no idea where he got this moniker) was a bit of a character, known to doctor himself with gunpowder (no smoking - please). He passed on in 1913 at the age of 83 leaving Lizzie alone for the next nine years despite many attempts by her niece Mrs. Charles Young to have her join her in Sunapee. She was found by a neighbor Isabel Halket frozen in death by the woodpile at age 84. The undertaker, Mr. Gage, brought her to Warner sitting up in the wagon beside him where she was buried in a long red dress with lots

of buttons. I have to believe that many a townie did a double take and swore off the sauce on seeing this apparition parading the streets of Warner."

This was an interesting local story that I, the editor, tried to find a bit more about. Perhaps it wasn't a "misfortune" for the couple after all. I traced 'Lizzie' backwards from the 1910 census to the 1850 census and found out her father's name, Stephen Sanborn. He is in V C Sanborn as # 480 vii on page 254. Stephen marries twice, first (1831) to Lois Colby (1806-26 April 1850). They had two children, Laura J (1833-83, married Franklin J Colby) and Eliza (our 'Lizzie') (born 23 April 1837 at Henniker NH) and V C Sanborn comments about her as still (1899) living in 'Henniker' - when she had been in Warner for about 40 years.

In the 1850 census Stephen Sanborn is in Henniker, 44, farmer, real estate worth \$2000; with his daughters, Laura (17) & Eliza (13) [NH, Merrimack County, Henniker, folio 55A]. The census was taken as of June 1, so his wife had been dead only 5 weeks. By the 1860 census he had moved to Warner, the next town north of Henniker, and had remarried sometime between 1850-60. He is there, aged 52 [note age discrepancy], farmer, real estate \$2000, personal estate \$1600; with second wife, Jane W (53), daughters Laura J (27) & Eliza (23), and farm laborer, Sylvester G Hoyt, 30, personal estate \$350 [NH, Merrimack County, Warner, folio 343B]. So, Sylvester shows up in the household at least as early as 1860.

Stephen Sanborn dies in July 1869, according to V C Sanborn, so he obviously isn't in the 1870 census. His widow, Jane W, is the head of the household in Warner, age 63 with a personal estate of \$500. With her are Eliza, 33, with real estate of \$2500; and Sylvester G Hoyt, 40, farmer, with real estate \$1200 and personal estate \$300 [NH, Merrimack County, Warner, folio 514]. Laura, again according to V C Sanborn, married 12 June 1860, immediately after the census of that year, so she is living with her husband and family in Sunapee, Sullivan County, NH - Franklin J Colby and their 3 children [folio 602A]. An interesting point about this census is that it seems like Eliza inherited her father's farm and that Hoyt also owns some real estate - this could be checked in the Merrimack County land records, possibly the probate records, too.

In 1880 Jane W Sanborn, 73, widow, is still the head of the

household; with Eliza Sanborn, 43, single, and Sylvester Hoyt, 50, single, farm laborer [NH, Merrimack County, Warner, Enumeration Dist 193, folio 476D].

In 1900 (the 1890 census was almost totally destroyed), Eliza Sanborn is now the head of the household, born April 1837, age 63, single, farmer, owns the farm; with Sylvester G Hoyt, boarder, born January 1830, 70, single [NH, Merrimack County, Warner, Enumeration Dist 177, sheet 6B].

They are still there in 1910: Eliza Sanborn, 72, single, farmer, owns farm; Sylvester G Hoyt, 80, single, has 'own income' [NH, Merrimack County, Warner, Enumeration Dist 229, sheet 1A]. He may have been enumerated twice as there is also a Sylvester Hoyt, 84, in the Odd Fellows Home, Concord [NH, Merrimack County, Concord, Enumeration Dist 203, sheet 5B].

Given the information above, having lived together in the same house for 50 plus years, they must have had a good relationship. The rest of the *SooNipi Magazine* article suggests that most of the land in that area was difficult to farm so they probably had a hard life, but at least it was together.

Mary Sanborn & George Avery

The editor noticed a reference in a recent NEHG Register to an article titled "Bible Records: George Avery & Mary Sanborn of Plainfield, New Hampshire." This article was published in the National Genealogical Society Quarterly, vol 90 (Dec 2002), pp 312-16. I took a quick look at it and discovered that there are a lot of Avery births, marriages, & deaths, descendants of a Mary Sanborn, born in Hawk 22 April 1765. When I got home I checked V C Sanborn and found what must be her: # 141 iii (page 142), Mary, born 21 Apr 1765 in Hawke NH. Her father was Joseph Clifford Sanborn (VCS # 141) of Hawke [now Danville NH]; his father was Abraham (VCS # 53) Sanborn of Kingston NH; his father was Tristram Samborn (VCS # 5) of Kingston; son of John (VCS # 5) Samborne; son of John Samborne (VCS # 2). Anyone who is interested in that branch of the Sanborn family should really check it out - you might be able to use it to find a lot more Sanborn cousins.

YORK COUNTY, MAINE

There was a brief item in the Bangor Daily News, 19 Jul 2004, in the column 'Family Ties' by Roxanne Moore Saucier. She mentions a website called "York County Genealogy and Virtual Cemeteries" at www.knights.hls-inc.net; it is maintained by Darlene Walsh. If any of you have ancestors from that part of Maine, this website is well worth looking at. There are general vital records for the county plus transcriptions of cemeteries & photos of some gravestones - it is a work in progress, so all the gravestones are not in the photo



section. Included are Sanborn Cemetery in Acton and Sanborn Cemetery in Waterboro ME. The site seems well organized and accessible; the pages downloaded quickly for me.

He has been working at UNH since 1971 in a variety of positions including 10 years as vice president of student affairs and over 10 years as executive assistant to the President of UNH. His new position is to be the interim executive director of the Alumni Association for 13 months while they search for a permanent director.

Thanks to SFA member, Nick Sanborn, for sending in news about his cousin, Wm Sanborn Pfeiffer ("Sandy"), who was named the interim President of Ramapo College NJ - serving from July 1, 2004. Al Sanborn continues to send me Sanborn items, for which I am very grateful. This time he sent me a letter he wrote to the AMC Outdoors Magazine. It was published in their June 2004 issue, pp 10-11. For the non-New Englanders, this is the Appalachian Mountain Club. Here is the letter, titled "The Ride of His Life".

"The inquiry about skiing Tuckerman Ravine (Wild Wisdom, April) reminded me of a once-in-a-lifetime event that occurred about 45 years ago. We were on our way down from the summit of Mount Washington [NH], hiking along above the headwall, when I made a sudden decision to wander over toward the top of the headwall, to a point where I could actually look right down the face. It's about 700 feet high, with the snowpack right then at a nicely packed 50-degree angle, by my estimation.

As I edged closer to the steepest part, I suddenly started slipping and sliding downward on my almost treadless boots. There was a moment or two when I could have arrested my descent, but I squandered that window of opportunity trying to decide what to do. Then, as my speed accelerated, my options became very limited. I could have sat down, and it did cross my mind, but I made the conscious decision to just 'let it happen' in the stand-up position.

The predominant sensation for the rest of my 'ride' was pure, raw terror. My life was, for what seemed like an eternity, in extreme danger of experiencing severe damage, or ending at any moment. There were no exposed rocks in my path, but a slight depression or other obstacle could have sent me flying, totally out of control, at very high speed.

Finally, the angle became less steep, and I became totally giddy, just about out of my mind with relief that I was going to be safe. When I came to a stop, breathing once again, I stood there in disbelief for only a little while – and decided I just had to do it again!

It wasn't easy getting back to the top, but I was able to kick toe-holes for traction. The second time down, I made believe I had skis on, and carved turns all the way down! By the way, the actual length of the glide works out to be about a thousand feet.

It was about 15 years later when I found out that there's actually a name for what I had done: glissade (as you may have known), and they do it all the time in the Alps. And all those years I thought I had invented a new sport!

Twenty years later, I was at the same place, with the same conditions, and decided to do it again. It came as a complete surprise to me that I was totally unable to force myself to get anywhere near that place of no return! With age comes wisdom — or better judgment, anyway!"



MORE ON ROSS SANBORN

The obituary below of Ross Sanborn refers to an article in the San Francisco Chronicle about him. It was written by Demian Bulwa, a Chronicle staff writer, & published on 8 Nov 2002 under the title "Profile: Ross Sanborn, awesome apricots, passionate pomologist pursues perfection." The profile describes his experience and expertise on fruits and vegetables as a farm advisor in California. About 28 years ago he received seeds from Iran for white apricot trees whose fruit were quite popular there. Sanborn developed a white apricot he called Angelcots. The article discusses how he continued to develop them and promote them and quoted chefs as to their quality. Ross also answered questions about his life and career.
